Wm. Gifford, who resides on Baya Creek, was recently arrested by Game Warden Leach and taken before Judge Stanley on the charge of eluding and gaffing salmon. He plead guilty and was fined \$50 and \$10 costs. The first of the week Mr. Leach discovered two hounds running deer near Garibaldi. The dogs had run two deer into the bay and one took refuge under the dock where the dogs were trying to kill it. It seems that the dogs belonged to Mr. Bechtz who recently left for Germany, and Mr. Leach could not find anyone who would lay claim to them. This being the case it is quite likely that the next time they are caught chasing deer they will pay the death penalty.

The Supreme Court has just handed down a decision in the case of N. McMillan vs. Tillamook County Court, wherein plaintiff brought suit which involved the location of the Garibaldi-Wheeler county road. The opinion handed down sets aside all the proceedings of the county court towards the establishing of the road and states that notices were defective and that Mr. McMillan was not given time to file claim against the county court. There is a recommendation in the decision as follows: "A sense of fair dealing demands that these proceedings should be set aside in order that another petition may be filed, notices thereof be given, proof given as required by law and a review and a resurvey of the proposed route be made." Attorney S. S. Johnson was attorney for the plaintiff.

Mrs. C. N. Drew and daughter Lelia returned on Wednesday from Portland where they attended the funeral of W. W. Wiley. It was thought at first that Mr. Wiley's funeral would be held in Beaverton, but this arrangement was later changed. The funeral services were held at the Holman undertaking parlors and interment took place at the Riverside Cemetery. Rev. Boyd of the First Presbyterian Church of Portland, preached the funeral sermon. Friends and prominent educators throughout the state acted as pall bearers. The pall bearers were W. R. Rutherford, C. H. Whitney, Harry Falkner, W. A. Wiley, Prof. Newbill, Prof. Ackerman of the Portland schools was to have acted as pall bearer but was called to Seattle. Those present at the funeral besides many friends were Mrs. C. N. Drew and daughter Lelia, Howard Drew, Miss Grace Whitehouse, Miss Jessie Wiley of Minnesota, a sister of the deceased and about twenty-five other relatives.
