The outside shipments are made because of lack of water as soon as the rains cease for any considerable length of time.

GREAT NITROGEN PLANTS IN OREGON ARE PREDICTED

University of Oregon, Eugene, May 4.—The widespread extraction of nitrogen from the air by means of electrical currents, and the use of this nitrogen in composition with substance like lime, as the world's principal land restorative, is predicted by Prof. O. F. Stafford, head of the department of chemistry in the state university. Extraction of nitrogen for fertilizing purposes is already on a commercial basis. Professor Stafford says decrease in productivity is as perilous to the adequacy of the world's food supply as the increase of population. Ultimate exhaustion of the artificial fertilizers such as the Chilean nitrates will leave the future densely populated planet in danger of famine if the soil is permitted to become depleted. "Most of the available agricultural land has been taken up now," says Professor Stafford.

Nitrogen supply in the atmospheric belt surrounding the earth is inexhaustible. "There is no limit to the nitrogen in the atmosphere, for every square inch of land on the earth's surface," says Professor Stafford, "and it is by use

of this that the earth's producing power will be kept up.

So much electrical power is necessary for extraction of this nitrogen, and for its transformation into usable form, that only a few countries can hope to become great nitrogen-extracting centers. One such country is Norway, where the process is now being used in several splendidly equipped plants. Another such country is Oregon, which is amply endowed with waterpower sufficient to put it beyond competition from most of the world's geographical divisions in cheap manufacture of nitrogen fertilizers.

COUNCIL GRANTS FRANCHISE

At a meeting of the city council on Thursday evening, a 25 year franchise was granted the Tillamook Light and Fuel Co. of this city.

The franchise granted is a model one, framed by the State Railroad Commissioner, and is satisfactory to all concerned.

The company now contemplates many improvements. E. J. Edwards, late of Newberg, has taken over Will Spalding's interest, in the company and will invest considerable money here.

Mr. Edwards went to Portland today for the purpose of securing a 500 K. W. steam turbine engine, with generator attached and a 250 h. p. Babcock tubular boiler. Other necessary equipment will also be added.

The company contemplates the establishing of a 24 hour service in about 90 days. In the meantime it is anticipated that between twenty and twenty-five thousand dollars will be spent on improvements in and near Tillamook City.

The inauguration of an all day service here will be welcome news as it will fill a long felt want.

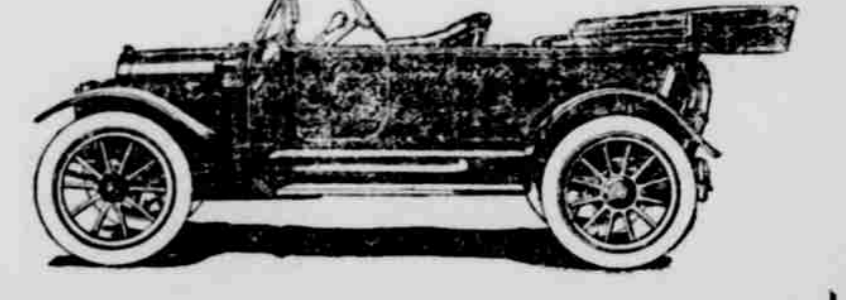
