COMMUNICATION

Editor Herald:

In the last issue of the Tillamook Herald there is an editorial comment on the vote for County Commissioner of Rockaway, Wheeler, Nehalem and Foley Precincts, that calls attention to the vote cast for the two candidates Sappington and Thompson, and to what the vote means. Now I wish to call the attention of the voters of Tillamook County to another analysis of this vote that I am sure Mr. Baker would not likely point out, and that is the vote of Wheeler and Nehalem towns that are incorporated. We all know that voters living outside of an incorporated town have no voice or vote in the matter of street improvement, but on the other hand the town people have a voice and vote on road matters, and this is a bad law and a rank injustice. We can trace most of our road troubles up here to the influence and work of those living in these towns who have real estate to sell, the result is that roads that are a necessity are delayed or not built at all, and money has been spent in a way that was wasteful and on roads where it was not needed, and the dairymen up here understood this better than others who do not live here, and we can give facts and figures if necessary to back our assertions. We are all in favor of good roads but we insist on building first the roads that are needed to give our people an outlet before spending thousands of dollars on cut-offs and costly bridges to help real estate men. Before closing I wish to call attention to the vote received by Mr. Thompson in his home precinct of Foley. Republican vote 30 for Thompson, 9 for Sappington, Democratic 4 for Thompson, 2 for Sappington, Progressive 1 for Thompson, Total vote 46. Thompson received 35 and Sappington 11. I wish also to give credit to the two members of our present County Court in this road matter, as great pressure was brought to bear on them to make a beginning on this projected road this year, when we have not money to build and finish roads that are an absolute necessity.

Following is the article from the Headlight to which Mr. McKimins has reference:

"We hear a great deal about the sovereign will of the people. The fight for county commissioner for the north end of the county is a good expression of the people in that part of the county. The fight was principally concerned over the proposed road from Wheeler to Nehalem. We will take the vote in the four precincts north of Tillamook Bay to show the will of the people in those parts, and it amounts to this: Nehalem, Sappington 177 votes and Thompson 64 votes. No one can question the will of the people with that amount of sentiment in favor of the construction of the road proposed now. Another thing it was Fairview, Bay, South Prairie and Maple Leaf which appeared to be opposed to the building of this road, if figures indicate anything. No doubt this will cause some comment, for, somehow, it does not look right for one road district to butt in and oppose public improvement in another road district. Let the people in each district rule."

MANAGING OF TOWNS NEW PROFESSION.

Managing towns is a new profession just beginning to open for young men, according to "Choosing a Calling," a booklet just issued by the University of Oregon at Eugene for high school students. In Oregon, La Grande and one or two other cities of good size have placed the administration of town business in the hands of a business manager, and their example seems likely to be followed widely in this state. An ardent advocate of this new mode of running towns is Professor Don C. Sowers, the municipal expert secured by the state university from the New York Bureau of Municipal Research whose business it is to give free council to Oregon communities in administrative matters. "Choosing a Calling" says:

"Within the last few years hundreds of American cities have altered their charters and placed their corporate interests in the hands of city managers, thus copying a system that has proved highly efficient in Germany. In Germany, a city manager who has shown special ability at the head of the government of a small city may reasonably expect a call to the executive chair of a large municipality, and if he has the qualities he will be promoted from city to city with increasing remuneration, both in money and in honor.

Not only is the city manager himself a trained man, but he wishes to employ trained men in municipal positions. He cannot succeed if he expects political hangers to do high-class work. A glance into the future reveals a calling here which the young man of the present day has still a chance to enter on the ground floor and which will lead to positions of dignity and honor."

Courses of training suggested for city managership are economics, political science, sociology, history, commerce, English and journalism.
