### LETTER FROM TILLAMOOK BOY IN ORIENT

U. S. S. Pisataqua, Anchor Station, Via San Francisco, Cal. Dear Mother:

Received your letter yesterday. Well we are back in Shanghai more more but leave Sunday for Chefoo.

We had a fine trip up from Obongosa. The water was smooth as glass all the way. We were three days from Obongosa to Amoy stayed there four days and then three days more to Shanghai. The Pisataqua surprised everyone on the trip. We kept up our speed of twelve knots all the way and did not break down, and all four torpedo boats had trouble but we all came together.

We are to base on Chefoo for three months and will have target practice there with the fleet and then visit all the Ports of North China and then spend October in Japan and back to Manila in November. All the fleet will be in Chefoo for the summer for all kinds of drills and admiral inspection. There is a new admiral here now and he seems to believe in moving the hips.

It sure will be better to spend the summer in Chefoo than Manila, the climate there is quite a bit like Tillamook Co. and that is the only place on the station where one can get good fruit and they raise all kinds of it there. Shanghai is a great place for strawberries but we are too late to get any this year, so I guess I will have to wait until I get home before I get any more.

If the Climax goes from here to New York, I sure am going to try hard to get on her even if I have to ship over for one more year, it certainly would be a fine trip but I don't think there is much chance of making it.

Tomorrow is the 4th but I will have to stay aboard, I had my celebration yesterday. Three of us got in an auto and took in the town and had a fine time so we will have to stay aboard and let the rest of the bunch go.

Well I can't think of anything to write so I will have to quit for this time.
