BETTER BABIES CONTEST.

Large Number of Healthy, Robust Babies Examined.

Eighty two Tillamook babies were examined on Monday, by a board of examiners for the prizes offered at the Tillamook County Fair at the Tillamook Commercial Club rooms.

It was a healthy, robust bunch of babies, and being a product of Tillamook County, there is a great deal of interest taken in the contest and who will win the prizes, which are divided into four classes.

1st—Child over 24 months and under 1 year, 1st prize \$10.00.

2nd—Child over 1 year and under 2 years, 1st prize \$5.00; 2nd prize \$3.00; 3rd prize \$2.00.

3rd—Child over 2 years and under 3 years, 1st prize \$15.00; 2nd prize \$10.00; 3rd prize \$5.00.

4th—Child over 3 years and under 4 years, 1st prize \$15.00; 2nd prize \$10.00; 3rd prize \$5.00.

The contest is carried on in conjunction with the Women's Home Companion, and in addition to the above cash prizes, two bronze medals will be given by the Women's Home Companion to the best boy and girl baby scoring the highest in the whole contest and will give certificates to the winner in each class.

There were about 120 babies entered for the contest, but only 82 were present on Monday for examination.

Classification of Lands About Mt. Hebo

Forest Supervisor Rankin, of Eugene, announced that word has been received of the final classification, by the Secretary of Agriculture, of a certain body in the Siuslaw National Forest, known as the Hebo classification project.

This project covers 36,615 acres, and is situated in Tillamook and Yamhill Counties, Oregon, almost wholly on the west side of the Coast Range, is drained on the north and west by the Little Nestucca River and Three Rivers, and on the south by the Little Nestucca River. That portion east of the Coast Range is drained by the Yamhill River and its tributaries. In other words, the land is described as all National Forest land in Sections 18 to 36 inclusive, T. 4 S., R. 8 W., T. 4 S., R. 9 W., and the NE 1/4 and Sections 21 to E/2 Section 27 inclusive, T. 5 S., R. 9 W. It is a rough mountain country, cut by sharp ridges and abrupt canyons. Mt. Hebo, 3,453 feet in elevation, stands almost in the center of the tract.

The project was examined by the Forest Service and Bureau of Soils experts. Owing to the broken character of the country, less than 5 per cent of the total area was found to be topographically suitable for agriculture, and by careful examination, only a little over 2 per cent or about 731 acres in small patches, could be classified as cultivable. There is much patented land surrounding the area, but most of this land has been abandoned. In fact there is only one settler within the boundaries of the project.

The entire area, however, is covered with a very good stand of young Douglas fir, either natural or reseeded. The Siuslaw Forest is one of the most productive in the country, from a forestry standpoint, the most recent estimate of yield being 10,000 ft. B. M. per acre per annum. The evidence is absolutely conclusive that the entire area of 36,615 acres should be classified as chiefly valuable for timber production, and the Secretary has so decided.
