On Wednesday afternoon a free-for-all fight took place in the Stephens' saloon in which Pate Wells was severely injured by being hit on the side of the head with a cuspidor. It seems that several Italians were drinking in the saloon when Clyde Blasler started interfering with them after which Wells got mixed in the racket and then a rough house ensued. No one else besides Wells was seriously injured.
