### ATTACK ON DIRECT PRIMARY

Salem, Ore., Jan. 29.-Efforts to break in upon the integrity of the direct primary precipitated a denouncment in the house yesterday afternoon that resulted in a demand for a call of the house to retrieve those who had fled to escape a rollcall. The situation arose when H. B. 19, introduced by Conrad P. Olson of Multnomah, came up for final passage. This bill proposes to abolish the system of circulating petitions of candidates and to substitute in its place a system whereby a candidate may deposit a stipulated fee with the secretary of state or county clerk and find place upon the primary ballot.

Miss Marian B. Towne of Jackson county led the flight in opposition. In a thrilling speech before the men members she declared the bill un-American and undemocratic and an attack upon the primary that should be countenanced by no legislator.

"If it is right to impose fees at all, it is right to fix the fees," she said. The next legislature may amend it by fixing the fees so that it will be impossible for young and ambitious attorneys and others to become candidates at all."

#### Nuisance of Petition Shovers

Mr. Olson had urged in support of nie bill that it is designed to abate the nuisance of "petition shovers" and to require candidates for office defeated at the primary to stay out of the race in a general election as independent candidates or candidates of another party than the one in which they are registered. He declared that under the present system the voters sign pe itions just to be rid of the "shovers" and asserted that "my dog Carlo" could get on the ticket for any office if a petition could be circulated for

Allen Eaton of Lane followed Miss Towne's address declaring the bill unprincipled as well as un-American. He declared his belief that Mr. Olson had taken his cue from the Oregonian in introducing the bid, reading from an editorial which commended his action.
