SHIP PURCHASE BILL BATTLE RESUMED

Democrats Confident They Will Force Roll Call on Measure Within a Few Days.

Washington.—Armistice in the senate legislative struggle over the ship purchase bill, which seems destined to take historic place in the annals of the United States congress, ended at 10 o'clock Monday, when the senate reconvened after a recess since Saturday midnight.
When democratic leaders consented Saturday to recess at midnight republican opponents of the bill insisted that it was a sign of weakening, but the generals of the administration forces insisted that they would carry the fight to the republicans with more vigor than ever throughout the week.
Republican leaders are just as determined and confident that they can keep up the fight until March 4, if necessary, and that the bill will not be permitted to pass at this session of congress.
House May Sustain Veto.
What will be the fate of President Wilson's veto of the immigration bill because of the restrictive literacy test is another subject of supreme interest in the congress for the week.
That some democratic members who voted for the bill do not propose to vote to override the president's rejection already is known and house leaders are not certain that the required two-thirds vote can be procured. Should the bill fail to receive a two-thirds vote it will die. If it passes, few doubt that the senate would give it considerably more than the necessary two-thirds majority, it having passed there originally by 50 to 7.

Lands Cheaply Logged Off

Feeney-Bremer Co., Put Economical Land Clearing Machine on Market

Tillamook, Oregon.
The Feeney-Bremer Co. has just completed a very economical device for clearing land in the shape of a gasoline donkey engine, equipped with a 10 h. p. heavy duty engine. The total weight of the machinery is 5,200 lbs. mounted on runners and can be pulled anywhere on a straight line by its own power.
The donkey part consists of a double drum, double friction, equipped with breaks. It has 400 feet of 1/2 inch cable and 800 feet of 3/8 inch cable. As a demonstration it recently pulled with ease a 20 foot log 3 feet in diameter over rough ground. Anyone wishing a demonstration of the workings of the machine can witness the same by calling at the Feeney-Bremer Co. Works.
The price for the above equipment ranges from \$700 for 10 h. p. up, larger sizes costing accordingly.
The engine consumes distillate, consuming 6 gallons in 10 hours, cost 10c a gallon.
The engine used is detachable and can be used for other things.
Feeney-Bremer Co. are offering a fine proposition for two or more farmers who wish to go in together on a device that will clear their land cheaply and easily. Two men can run the machinery used and handle it successfully.
Those who may have use for such a machine will do well to investigate.

New Revolution Started in Mexico.

El Paso, Tex.—A movement directed against the Carranza and Villa elements in Mexico has been launched by the Cientificos party which supported Diaz and the Huerta regime, according to authentic information received here. The new movement is said to have received the adherence of many formerly wealthy landowners.

CANAL OPENING DELAYED

President Wilson, however, proposes to visit Exposition in March.
Washington.—Formal announcement of the postponement of opening ceremonies at the Panama canal from March until some time in July was made by Secretary Daniels after a cabinet meeting.
In July the Atlantic fleet will pass through the canal and all of the other ceremonies planned for President Wilson's attendance in March will be held. The report of Governor Goethals of slides in Culebra cut was given by Mr. Daniels as the reason for the postponement.
It was definitely announced that President Wilson expects to go to the San Francisco exposition in March, despite the postponement of the opening of the canal, and will make a special trip to Panama in July.

GERMAN CRUISER SUNK BY BRITISH

Two Other Cruisers Are Badly Damaged and Attack on Coast Frustrated.

London.—An attempt by a German cruiser squadron to repeat the attack recently made on Scarborough, the Hartlepool and other British coast towns was frustrated by the British patrolling squadron.
In a running fight the German armored cruiser Bluecher was sunk and two German battle cruisers were seriously damaged.
The British fleet did not escape unscathed. The battle cruiser Lion, which led the British squadron and the torpedo-boat destroyer Meteor both were disabled and had to be towed into port while one officer and 13 men were killed and three officers and 26 men wounded on three of the ships—the Lion, Tiger and Meteor.
This information is contained in an admiralty statement.
The statement gives denial to the German reports that one British cruiser and two torpedo-boat destroyers were sunk, by declaring that all the British ships engaged in the action have returned to port in safety.
A witness of the naval battle on Sunday in the North Sea, who has reached Harwich, describes the sinking of the German armored cruiser Bluecher as a terrible sight. The sea was covered with debris and men struggling for their lives.
