A DEAD BILL

From Journal:

The hydro-electric utility bill was a splendid measure. It was a very important and constructive measure.

It was prepared by the hydro electric commission, headed by Honorable H. B. Miller, after a thorough investigation of the operation and effects of similar laws in other states. It was discussed for a day at the Commonwealth Conference at the state university and had the unqualified endorsement of that organization. It had the approval of the House which passed it with a heavy majority.

The purpose of the bill was to give the people of the rural communities authority to organize districts for establishing their own public utilities, such as water works, electric power and light, and for other uses of hydro-electric energy. It was a plan to give people of rural districts the same modern facilities as to light and power as are enjoyed by city people.

But the bill was looked upon with disfavor by the special interests. That doomed it to slaughter, and by that slaughter, all the patient investigation all the public consideration and all the earnest endeavor in behalf of the welfare of the people of Oregon was sent to the scrap heap by the Senate.

The water power interests want the water powers of Oregon, and they do not propose to permit the people to use those great natural resources except by paying tribute to private monopoly if in their power to prevent.

BONDS ARE SOLD.

City Disposes of \$40,000 Worth of Bonds at 3 Per Cent.

At a meeting of the City Council on Monday evening bids were opened for the disposal of \$40,000 worth of city bonds. There were eleven bidders and the low bid was that of Geo. I. and J. A. MacPherson, of Portland, Oregon, which was \$3,000 per thousand in a premium. The bid was accepted by the city council and the money is to be used to pay off the city's outstanding indebtedness and for the purpose of building a bridge across the Necanicum slough, which is a dangerous condition. It will be necessary to call an election to authorize the city council to spend the money for this bridge.
