Christian Church Notes




The Russian offensive operations at pear to extend along the whole fron an indication that the Russians hav been able to bring strong reinforce ments into the field. They have suc cessfully checked the German advance in north Poland, where the German are reported to be in retreat, and th recapture of Przasynsz after sever. fighting has given them an excellen pivotal front from which to carry of their further operations.

The allies do not believe that theil success in the Dardanelles undertak ing will be immediate, for they are now facing the hardest part of the problem, having the strongest forte ahead of them, although the guns o these forts have not the range of the guns of the larger ships, particularly the 15-inch guns of the Queen Eliza beth.

While eight British ships have been destroyed in the first week that the blockade has been in force, it is point ed out that they are for the most par small vessels, and that the majority of them, instead of having food for this country, were either in ballast of carrying coal or other freight for neu tral countries.

In the house of commons Sir Ed ward Grey, secretary for foreign af fairs, made the important announce ment, which was received with cheers that Great Britain sympathized with Russia's aspirations to gain access to

If this policy is enforced it will no longer be possible to ship cotton, manufactured articles and commodities bitherte ef a sen-contraband characte. from the United States to Germany directly or andirectly, and from the latter country the supply of dyestuir-tion in this country will be cut off. It was regarded as practically cortain that the United States would rply promptly with an inquiry as to how the step was to be carried into practice, together with a protest against the announcement that com merce between Germany and neutral countries hereafter would be interrupted by the allies.

ALLIES' SHIPS SHELL URKS' INNER FORTS

London .- Twenty-eight warships of the allied fleet entered the Dardanelles and bombarded the inner forts, according to a dispatch from Athens. After having completed the destruction of the forts at the entrance of the Dardanelles, the allied fleet of British and French warships, the greatest which has ever been in action, attacked the chief forts, which heretofore have stood between Turkey and invasion by the sea.

Apparently the outer forts could not withstand a great bombardment, and when they had been leveled and deserted by their defenders, men were landed from the ships to complete the work of demolition, while mine-sweepers cleared a passage for ships in the straits.

At the head of the fleet is the Queen Elizabeth, one of England's latest super-dreadnoughts, which has been commissioned since the war began and which mounts eight 15-inch guns

The steady progress of the international fleet against the fortresses here tofore regarded as impregnable has caused terror in Constantinople.

Will Exchange Wounded.

Berlin by wireless to Savville, L. I -It was announced here that France and Germany had reached an agree ment whereby seriously wounded prisoners, incapable of returning to the front, were to be exchanged.

Churches Unite in Peace Letter. New York-The Church Peace Union, founded a year ago by Andrew Carnegie, through its secretary, the Rev. Frederick Lynch, made public here a message which the union has addressed to "the churches and clergy of America," cautioning ministers and church people against partisanship in discussing the European war, and protesting against the present agitation for increased armaments. This is said to be the first time in church history that Catholics and Protestants have joined in signing a common letter addressed to the churches.

Utah House Votes Dry.

Salt Lake City, Utah .- The Wooten state-wide prohibition bill passed the house by a vote of 40 to 5. It passed! the senate about two weeks ago. The senate bill was amended by the house to prohibit the manufacture of wine for sacramental or personal use and to make it effective July 1, 1916, instead of June 1, 1916.
