## WILL SEND CASH TO MEXICO

Navy Department to Aid Twine Makers to Mexican Hemp.

Washington—an American warship will take up Texian money to finance the movement of Mexico's sisal hemp crop needed to make twine for binding Mexican wheat crop, made by farmers of the United States this year. The money—\$225,000 in currency, which manufacturers propose to advance to the hemp growers—is in bank vaults at Houston, Tex., but no safe means of getting it to Mexico had been found.

Secretary Daniels agreed to permit the use of a warship for the purpose, after hearing a statement by representatives of the hemp purchasers, who outlined the difficulties that had been encountered.

## America to Seize German Steamer.

Washington.—Attorney General Gregory instructed the United States District Attorney of Porto Rico to institute libel proceedings against the German steamer Odenwald, which attempted to leave San Juan harbor without clearance papers.

Under these proceedings the vessel may be held in the custody of a marshal pending settlement of the question whether she shall be forfeited to the United States, under the recent joint resolution of congress prescribing penalties in such cases.

## Suffrage Lost in Maine.

August, Me.—The cause of equal suffrage met defeat in the legislature here, although it had a good-sized majority. The resolution in the house fell short of the two-thirds vote required for its adoption.

## Texas Fruit Hard Hit.

Marshall, Tex.—With the thermometer as low as 22 degrees this week, fruitgrowers say the Harrison county fruit crop is ruined and the yield in the main Texas belt this year will be way below normal.

## SAN JUAN FORTS FIRE ON STEAMER

San Juan, Porto Rico.—The German merchant steamer Odenwald, which attempted to leave port without obtaining clearance papers, was stopped as she was passing out the entrance to the harbor by two shots across her bows from a five-inch gun and direct shots from a Maxim. She then returned and was taken in charge by the collector of customs.

Permission to sail was refused the Odenwald by the collector, pending instructions from Washington.

Failing to obtain the necessary clearance papers, her commander apparently decided to risk the attempt to put to sea. A heavy gun on Morro Castle sent two shots across her bows as a warning, but it was not until the machine gun opened a direct fire that the steamer stopped and headed back to port.
