AUSTRIA DECLARED MAKING LAST STAND

Vienna Reports Sanguinary Engagement but Says Enemy Was Repulsed.

Vienna—That the Russian advance into the Carpathians is making ground is asserted by Central White Vienna after Saturday fighting.

The defense of the Carpathians is the last effort Austria-Hungary can make, says the Times correspondent with the Russian forces, westward from Kiev, and if her troops fall there nothing can prevent the Russian invasion of Hungary.

A description of conditions under which desperate fighting is carried on in the Carpathians, says a Berlin dispatch, is contained in a dispatch to the National Tribune from its special correspondent who writes that the only of the front line is completely broken and that it is so broken up by mountain lands and rivers that any further Russian progress would be a colossal task.

The Russians have been besieging the Carpathians for several days in an effort to break the Austrian line. The Austrians are in the line between the Tatra mountains and the Carpathians. The Russian army there the National Tribune says have long been engaged in a desperate fight against the Austrian line.

BULGARIANS ATTACK SERBS

Roaming Bands Cross Frontier, Taking Two Canon and Positions.

Roads blocked in Bulgaria have made it difficult for the Serbian troops, according to dispatches received here.

A Serbian workhouse at Vrnovci was attacked, the dispatches declare. The Bulgarians captured two cannon and several positions in the hills on the Serbian border. The Bulgarians have been in contact with Serbian forces since the capture of the workhouse.
