OREGON NEWS NOTES OF GENERAL INTEREST

Events Occurring Throughout the State During the Past Week.

Want Road Engineer Abolished.
St. Helens.—A petition containing approximately 1200 names of taxpayers was presented to the county court here asking for the abolition of the office of county road engineer. The petitions were circulated in practically every part of the county except in St. Helens. The greatest number of names were signed by residents of Clatskanie, Rainier and Scappoose. These petitions were initiated by the Columbia county taxpayers' league, the principal allegation being that the office of county road engineer is unnecessary and a useless expense.

Counties Get Federal Money.
Salem.—Secretary of State Oleott has announced the apportionment among the various counties of the 5 per cent land sales fund received from the government from the sale of public lands in the state. Under the federal law it is provided that the state shall receive 1 per cent of the monies derived from the sale of public lands and this year it totals \$2,056,42. The secretary of state distributes it among the counties and the money must be used for building roads.

Woman and 2 Men Taken as Robbers.
Baker.—Molly BURGOT and Joe CARLSON were arrested at Miller, and William HALDER, known as "Sour Dough Bill," was formally arrested in the Huntington jail, charged with the hold up of the Rainbow-Durkee stage and the theft of \$7000 in gold bullion in Rye Valley. The bullion was found in a hedge hole about a mile from the scene of the hold up by Sheriff Anderson.

11 COUNTIES QUARANTINED

State Board Declares Prevalence of Rabies Demands Precautions.
Salem.—To prevent the spreading of rabies, the state livestock sanitary board has issued an order placing 11 counties under quarantine. It was announced that the disease had been communicated by coyotes to horses, dogs, cats and other animals in eight counties in the eastern part of the state. The counties included in the quarantine are Lake, Harney, Crook, Baker, Umatilla, Malheur, Wheeler and Union, where rabies prevails, and Multnomah, Clackamas and Jackson, to which it is feared the disease may spread.

The order requires that all dogs, unless used in herding livestock, be muzzled. State Veterinarian Lytle said that all violators of the quarantine would be punished to the fullest extent of the law, the penalties being fines from \$50 to \$100 for each offense. Mr. Lytle announced that all peace officers would be called upon for assistance in enforcing the order. The veterinarian declared that conditions were especially alarming in Lake County, rabid coyotes and dogs running the range in large numbers. He said that many cattle and a number of persons had been bitten there.

New Road Planned.
Klamath Falls.—A road connecting Ashland with Klamath county scenes of interest such as Crater lake and Upper Klamath lake, and with Klamath Falls for commercial advantages to both communities is being advocated by the Ashland commercial club, and representatives have been here conferring with local people to ascertain what aid may be secured from Klamath.

Wheat is Sent by Mail.
Baker.—A stream of 50-pound packages of wheat is going through here on their way from La Grande to Burns. Several carloads are on the way and more are expected. The Sawyer-Clark company is loading the wheat at Island City, near La Grande, and it is going to different parties at the interior city. It will travel 125 miles by rail and nearly 100 miles by stage, but is in the 100-mile parcel post zone.

Mining Exhibit to Start.
Baker.—Oregon's exhibit at the Panama-Pacific Exposition at San Francisco will be started on its way this week and installed probably next week, says Fred R. Melis, who has charge of the exhibit. He is now gathering specimens from this part of the state and will include his own private collection, which is valued at many hundreds of dollars.

Grants Pass Land to Get Water.
Grants Pass.—The farmers in that portion of Rogue River valley just west of Grants Pass have organized a co-operative irrigation corporation. Owners of approximately 1000 acres of land have signed up, and nearly two miles of irrigation ditches have been built.
