3 LOST IN DANDON WRECK

Schooner Randolph Upset by Breaker While Making Port.

Bandon, Or.—One passenger and two members of the crew of five of the gasoline schooner Randolph were drowned when the vessel capsized in off the bar here. Of the three remaining members of the crew one was ashore and the other two were taken from the engine room alive, one hot later when the boat washed ashore.

R. E. Kuorr, a druggist of Go Beach; Milton Cox, of this city, coc on the boat, and E. L. McConnell, of Landolo, Or., manager and part owner of the craft, were the men who lost their lives.

The Randolph was attempting to make port here when the accident happened. When about 300 feet on side of the jetty she was hit by a breaker that keeled her over and immediately following this came or which capsized her.

WOMEN'S PEACE CONFERENCE OPEN

The Hague, via London.—Forty-two delegates from the United States to the International Women's Peace Congress, who had been held up on the steamer Noordam because of Great Britain's order stopping traffic to Holland, arrived here.

Stirring addresses of greeting were delivered by Anita Augspurg, of Munich; Madame Tubberg, of Denmark; Katherine Courtney, of London; Olga Misar, of Vienna; Anna Klemm, of Stockholm; Mrs. Fannie Fern A. draws, of Boston; Vilma Bluecklic of Budapest; Rosa Genoli, of Milan; Dr. Kellau, of Norway, and Mia Bolsevald, of Amsterdam.

A thrill seemed to stir the audience as the women of the various nations uttered sympathetic references to their sorrows and hardships of their sister Anita Augspurg aroused the enthusiasm of the delegates when she declared that womanly feelings were above all race hatred and that the German women stretched out their hands for friendship and international love.

Miss Courtney reciprocated with the assurance that English women recognized that women of other nations, sisters, were heartily thankful to the neutral nations for calling the gathering, declaring that all women their hearts wished for peace.
