A German Submarine Makes Attack Off Scilly Islands.

London. The American oil tank steamship Gulflight was sunk by a German submarine off the Scilly Is lands, according to a dispatch to the Central News Agency. The Guiflight skiled from Port Arthur, Tex., April 10, for Rouen, France.

Peace Congress at The Hague Ends. The Hague.-All neutral countries will be invited to take steps for a conference at which they can offer continuous mediation to the warring European nations and also to invite suggestions from the belligerents themselves as to the most reasonable propossis for a basis for peace.
