### BRIEF NEWS OF OREGON

Miss Justice Carter was elected queen of the strawberry carnival at Roseburg.

Cook and Curry counties will hold their dairy show and annual fair at Myrtle Point.

The Polk county chautauqua will be held in Dallas this year from July 4 to 19, inclusive.

One thousand former students of Albany College are expected to attend a big reunion in Albany on June 15.

The Seventh Annual Live Stock Show will be held at Union Wednesday, Thursday and Friday, June 2, 3 and 4.

The twenty-seventh annual convention of the Episcopal diocese of Oregon opened Wednesday in Trinity church at Portland.

Governor Withycombe has issued a proclamation declaring June 11, the last day of the Rose Festival at Portland. Oregon's holiday of roses.

Mrs. W. H. Dancy of Salem, has been appointed a member of the advisory board of the industrial school for girls by Governor Withycombe.

For the purpose of perfecting an organization and mapping out plans for the future, the new fish and game commission will hold a meeting at Salem May 26.

Quilapais, as well as other regularly licensed physicians, can sign death certificates, according to an opinion of Attorney General Brown, for the state board of health.

The second largest prune orchard in Oregon, which is located near Glendale, Douglas county, has been purchased by J. H. Bond of Linn county, from Mrs. Grace W. Baker of Roseburg.

John C. Cady, the flax expert employed by the state board of control to install a flax plant at the penitentiary, has been authorized to go east and purchase the needed machinery.

Seventy-five of Oregon's 107 postmasters of presidential offices have accepted Postmaster Myers' invitation to attend a convention in Portland June 9, 10 and 11, during the Rose Festival.

Construction upon the \$239,000 Siuslaw jetty project should be under way by July 1, giving employment for 75 men more than two years, according to I. B. Cushman, chairman of the Siuslaw Port Commission.

Salmion by the thousands are clogging the Umatilla river just below the diversion dam for the West Umatilla project, unable to get above the dam, owing to the fact that the fish ladder is too short for the large-size fish.

The first fatal accident of the fishing season occurred at Astoria, when Harry Kamyalla, a boatpuller, was washed overboard as a landing was being made alongside the fish-receiving scow at Sand Island. He sank before aid could reach him.

Secretary of State Olcott announced that the price of the session laws of the 28th legislative assembly, which are ready for distribution earlier than usual is \$1.55, delivered. Each member of the legislature will be supplied with a copy free of charge.

Fifty-three accidents, none of them fatal, were reported during the week to Labor Commissioner Hoff. Railroad workers were the most unfortunate, 16 of them being hurt, while many engaged in logging and employed in sawmills were also injured.

Oregon piling will be utilized in reconstruction work being carried on at the big navy drydock at Pearl harbor, Hawaiian islands, the Charles R. McCormick company of Portland having obtained a contract for the delivery of 4050 pieces of piling there.

Superintendent Steiner has been notified that no more patients from the asylum for the insane would be accepted for deportation to belligerent countries. Steiner had intended to deport three subjects of Great Britain and had engaged passage for them on the next scheduled sailing of the unfortunate Lusitania.

At the annual meeting of the board of regents of the state normal schools at Monmouth, it was voted to turn the normal school properties at Weston and Ashland over to the school districts in which they are located to use for school purposes, until such time as the state or legislature makes some disposition of the buildings or may decide to reopen them as training places for teachers.

Grant county is improving and shortening many of its roads. The county court has approved the Canyon City-Dayville road through the gorge of the John Day river, which has cut several miles of travel between the two places. The road was considered a gigantic undertaking because it had to be cut through solid rock for nearly a mile. The cost was \$4000, much less than the estimate.

Governor Withycombe appointed Mrs. Clyde Apperson, of McMinnville, as a member of the Oregon Child Welfare commission, to succeed Mrs. J. H. Smith, of Astoria. Mrs. Smith resigned, not being able to devote sufficient time to the work. The other members of the commission are: Mrs. Robert H. Tate, chairman, Portland; Dr. Mae H. Cardwell, Portland; Geo. Rebec, Ph. D., Medford, and L. B. Alderman, Portland.
