BOY NARROWLY ESCAPES DROWNING.

On Sunday, Raymond Lowrance, Harry Endner and Wade Arstell, of Cloverdale, all boys in their early teens, were swimming near one of the big holes just below the Nestucca River bridge at Cloverdale, when the Lowrance boy, son of John Lowrance, got out too far and was caught in a powerful eddy and made almost helpless. First, one of his companions tried to get him out and then the other did likewise, but to no avail. Then the Endner boy tried to get a scow to him, but this could not be done. Finally, about the time the Lowrance boy was thoroughly overcome the Endner boy made a last desperate effort and got the drowning boy by the hair and with the aid of the other boy got him out. The boys called for help and at once set to work to revive young Lowrance, but it was not until more than a half hour had passed before he began to show signs of life.

Both young Endner and Arstell deserve a great deal of credit for the manly way in which they stuck to their heroic and difficult task.

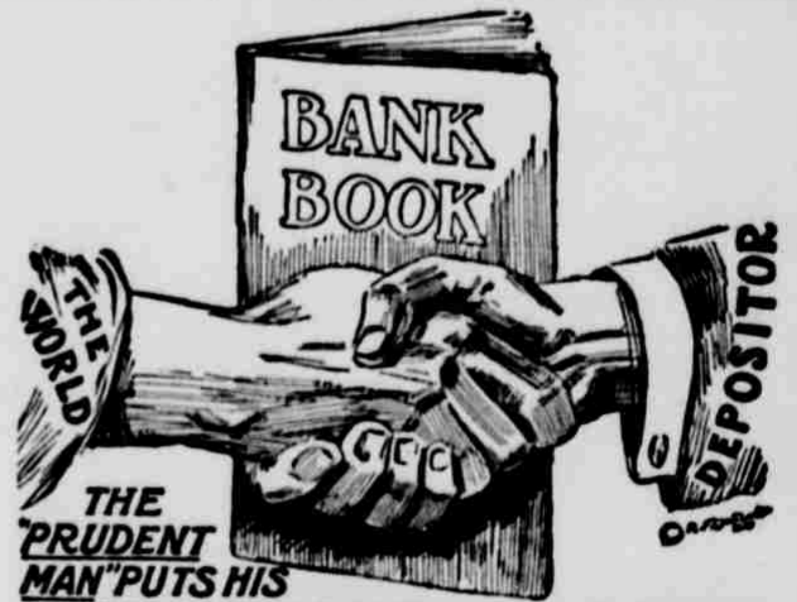
Miss Paddock who gave the opening number plays with much style and finish displaying superb technique combined with the necessary ringing tone so essential for Mendelssohn's compositions. This was followed by Mrs. Simmons singing Arditis brilliant waltz song "Il Bacio," and Metcalfe's sympathetic "Absent" which she sang delighting her audience with a voice which was resonant and clear, which she used with fluency and intelligence.

Her warm voice and convincing style was at its best in "A Perfect Day" by Bond which received prolonged applause—responding with an effective encore, Salter's "Dandelion." Her great variety of songs gave the audience a chance to judge of her vocal abilities, especially impressing a remarkable pure legato and delicate phrasing.

Mrs. Gilhouse, who is a violinist of unusual ability played with full broad tone. Her individuality of interpretation was expressed to advantage in all her numbers especially in "The Swan" by Saint-Saens, and "The Dutch"—Van Dittersdorf.
