New Service By Hill System

Str. Sue H. Elmore Will Make Connections with Hill Liners at Flavel for Tillamook and Bay City

As a result of the inauguration of the new service by Great Northern Pacific Steamship Co.'s steamers "Great Northern" and "Northern Pacific," Tillamook Bay will in the future enjoy a big increase of Commerce with San Francisco.

Steamers leaving San Francisco will deliver cargo destined for Tillamook Bay points at Flavel, in time to make connections with the Str. "Sue H. Elmore" every Wednesday morning, making it possible under ordinary circumstances to land freight in Tillamook City forty eight hours after it leaves San Francisco, owing to the Cold Storage facilities on the Hill steamers perishable goods of all kinds may be shipped and arrive in first class condition.

A large portion of our cheese is now sent to San Francisco and Southern California points and the new service will expedite the time about three days, which in these days of quick fluctuations in the cheese market is a matter of no small moment.

Heretofore the greater part of the freight shipments to and from California points, have had to be carried to Portland and thence by either Str. or Rail to destination. The new plan by which the Hill Steamers is to share in the business will prove a great deal more satisfactory as it provides faster service in every way.

THEY CAN'T BEAT TILLAMONK

Tillamook took another grip on the pennant Sunday at Nehalem when they put that team to rout, the final count showing Tillamook winner by a score of 2 to 1, or in actual figures 16 to 8 which amounts to practically the same proportion. The game, however, was much better than the score would indicate, both teams playing air tight ball with no hits, runs or errors up to the first of the fifth, when Nehalem lunched hits on Blanchard and filled the bases, and when the scorekeeper got the record complete it was 5 to 0 for Nehalem. Tillamook failed to score in their half, but in the sixth Alderman started the fireworks by a long drive to right which was dropped by Matley, and Nehalem proceeded to ascend to the dizzy heights where they remained while Tillamook hit, ran and made errors at pleasure. The batteries were: Staask, Emery and Atwood for Nehalem and Blanchard and Heitzman for Tillamook.

Bay City went to Beaver and regained second place by defeating that team 5 to 3. It was a very good exhibition of baseball from start to finish. A large number of fans from Bay City accompanied the team to Beaver.

The games for next Sunday have not been announced, but there is a possibility of a big double header being played in Tillamook, Nehalem vs. Beaver at 1:00 p. m. and Tillamook vs. Bay City immediately following. Definite announcement will be made later.
