CARRANZA ANSWERS WILSON'S MESSAGE

Washington.—Venustiano Carranza's answer to the presidential mandate which President Wilson sent to all the Mexican revolutionary leaders to get together and save the country from starvation, was made public by the state department.

The statement is regarded as a bid for recognition. Carranza asserts that opposition to his government practically has been overthrown and that nine-tenths of the population of the whole country is now under his authority.

VILLA ASKS MEXICAN UNION

In El Paso, Tex.—General Villa has replied to President Wilson's note to the leaders in Mexico. He invites a "union of all Mexicans" to secure triumph of revolutionary principles, especially the agrarian problem and the education of the poor.

General Villa in this invitation for a conference points out two reasons for his action. First, that unless the centralists reorganize the movement the Científicos (Diaz party) will again get control under the guise of another name, and, second, unless conditions in Mexico are improved the United States will intervene.

The Villa reply to President Wilson is friendly in its terms. It explains that General Villa makes the reply in his own name, believing he can affirm it in the name of all factions whose political tendencies are represented by the conventionalist government and supported by the armistice under his command.

Bryan Appeals to German-Americans. Washington.—William Jennings Bryan issued an appeal addressed to "the German-Americans" urging them to aid in maintaining peace between the United States and the fatherland by exerting their influence with the German government to persuade it not to take any steps that would lead in the direction of war.

Two Men Hold up Oregon City Cars. Portland.—The Oregon City electric train which left Portland at 10 o'clock Sunday night was held up by two armed men at 11:10 o'clock between Vinyard and Glen Echo stations, about 10 miles south of Portland and lost estimated at \$100 to \$500 taken.
