




PAVING COMPANY WANTS

TO COMPROMISE

On Tuesday evening attorneys for the citizens who brought suit against the Warren Construction Co., met with a large number of the litigants and put before them a proposition which the Warren Construction Co. had made,

which was to the effect that the company would reduce the price of the paving 25¢ per yard on all pavement,

waive all interest due on all pavement to date which would amount to \$32,000,

and pay the litigants \$25,000 with which they could pay their attorneys and other expenses they had been to.

Some of the litigants think this a fair proposition while others feel that the litigants should receive a greater degree of preference over those who would not go into the fight against the company, and in consequence a counter proposal has been made the company.

Some of the non-litigants are beginning to take a different view of the situation since the paving company has offered to compromise. Of course should any of the non-litigants be dissatisfied, they have access to the courts to the same extent that the present litigants have had.

Circuit Court Cases.

In the case of W. G. Dwight vs. John Kirby, et al, it was continued on condition that defendant pay to the plaintiff \$500 in 10 days.

In the case of Carl G. Shagren vs. the estate of Carl G. Shagren, et al, administrator of the estate of deceased G. Smith, asking that the judgment made and rendered be set aside and that the administrator be allowed to file an answer to the complaint, it appears to the court that no motion was well taken and that the judgment was rendered because of mistake, the motion was granted and the judgment set aside.

In the case of George Johnson vs. P. J. Hall, E. W. Keall and W. J. Stephens, upon a demurrer to the further and separate answer of the defendant it was overruled and the plaintiff given 10 days in which to file a reply.

In the case of John Staker vs. Oleson et al, the judge ordered a decree entered against the defendants.
