LOGGING ROAD UNDER CONSTRUCTION

Boetz, Storey & Duffy, contractors of Seattle, have taken the contract to construct three miles of logging road for the Coats Driving & Boom Co., from tide water to the Coats Lumber Co. timber on Bewley Creek. The work of clearing the right of way is now in progress, and the construction of the railroad which will be standard gauge will progress as circumstances will permit.

BRIEF WAR NEWS

Two American steamers, the Llana and Wico, oil laden for Sweden, have been captured by the Germans.

In evacuating Warsaw and other cities the Russians have systematically and effectively removed everything, including church bells, that might be of use to the Germans.

The Russian newspapers are unanimous in stating that Russia's determination to pursue the war to a victorious end has been strengthened by the enforced evacuation of Warsaw.

Navogorjevsk, the great Russian fortress to the north of Warsaw, is now the sole possession of the Russians along the Vistula river.

The Russian troops, led by Prince Leopold, were first to enter Warsaw, but not without fierce resistance on the part of the Russians, who retired toward the direction of Minsk.

On the western front and along the Austro-Italian fronts artillery engagements predominate, and at various points each of the contending forces holds small positions.

Occupation of Warsaw by the German army ends the greatest campaign of the war—of all wars, of all history. It has been fought along a front of 1000 miles, extending from the Baltic to the frontier of Rumania. According to the most authoritative figure, there have been between 5,000,000 and 7,000,000 men engaged in almost daily conflict.

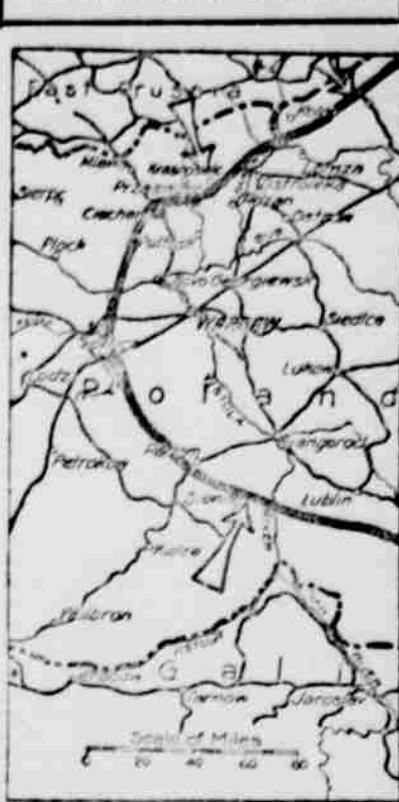

WILSON PLANS FOR NATIONAL DEFENSE

Cornish, N. H.—With the object of developing a broad and convincing program of national defense which will meet with the approval of congress President Wilson is planning to co-operate with the chairmen of the military and naval affairs committees of the senate and house, as well as with Secretaries Garrison and Daniels of the war and navy departments, before finally deciding on the recommendations he will make in his next message to congress.

When the president sees the chairmen of the four committees he expects to have before him the reports now being prepared by Mr. Garrison and Mr. Daniels.

Portland, Ore.—"I am in thorough sympathy with the president's plan of calling a conference of committee chairmen and cabinet officers to consider a program for national defense," said Senator Chamberlain, chairman of the senate committee of military affairs.

Senator B. R. Tillman of South Carolina, chairman of the senate committee on naval affairs, who is passing the summer in Portland, also endorsed the proposed conference and said he was prepared to attend if called.

GERMANS PAY EOR FRYE

Treaty Not to Be Waived, but Necessity for Arbitration Obviated.

Washington.—The American reply to the last German note regarding the sinking of the American ship William P. Frye has been cabled to Berlin.

While the original position of the state department that the Prussian-American treaty of 1828 was violated by the destruction of the vessel is reaffirmed, it is understood that the United States now agrees to accept payment for the Frye under the condition suggested in the last German note, obtaining an appeal to arbitration at The Hague.

Germany stipulates that payment shall not involve admission of a treaty violation; the American note is said to stipulate that no treaty rights are waived by acceptance. The amount to be paid will be fixed by two commissions, one appointed by each government.

Austria's Views Rejected.

Washington.—The United States government dispatched to Vienna a reply rejecting the Austro-Hungarian views recently set forth in a note contending that the great scale on which war munitions are being exported from America to enemies of the German allies "is not in consonance with the definition of neutrality."
