LEO FRANK IS LYNCHED
Is Hanged to Tree 100 Miles From Prison Farm.
Marietta, Ga.—Leo M. Frank, serving a life term for the murder of Mary Phagan, the Atlanta factory girl, and who was taken from the prison farm at Milledgeville Monday night, was lynched 100 miles east of here by the armed party which took him. He was hanged to a tree.
Frank was brought 100 miles from the prison farm to a point almost within sight of the former home of Mary Phagan.
Frank's body, barefooted, and clad only in prison trousers and shirt, was found at 8:30 o'clock Tuesday morning.
