TILLAMOOK COUNTY IN A NUTSHELL.

Tillamook means "Many Waters." Rivers fall off into the grand old Pacific Ocean, with its bathing beaches, scenery, fish, commerce and cheap freight.

Tillamook city has 2000 population, county seat, steady growth, four miles asphalt streets, electric light plant, 24 hours service, modern gravity water works, city ownership, pure health water, \$20,000 new city high school, graded school, new complete sewer system, lowest death rate any Western city, modern court house, one of the best modern hotels, eight churches, one new church edifice costing \$20,000, Catholic church and Academy, New Odd Fellow's Block costing \$20,000, new Masonic Temple costing \$25,000, concrete and brick business blocks, two strong banks in commodious homes with half million deposits, two telephone systems, 200 milk, dairies, two weekly newspapers, and we are in our infancy, with only one railroad for only three years, the S. Bar View is one of the most popular resorts in the county. Here is located the life saving station under the command of Capt. Farley, who has several expert men at his disposal. Life saving dories are often given at this beach to the delight of the spectators. Bar View has a fine hotel and all other accommodations that go with a first class resort.

MEXICAN FIRE ON U. S. BORDER PATROL

Brownsville, Texas.—A detachment of the United States cavalry patrol was fired on from the Mexican side of the Rio Grande near Progresso. The cavalrymen returned the fire.

Corporal Wilman is reported to have been killed and Lieutenant Roy O. Henry and Private Jackson wounded.

Rangers and peace officers are disarming all Mexicans outside of the larger towns throughout the Brownsville section.

Firerams discovered in the possession of Mexicans in rural communities of this section is practically equivalent to a death warrant unless that Mexican is well known to Americans as being peaceful. Even with such a record, firerams are confiscated and a warning given not to obtain any more.
