Albany, N. Y .- New York's constitutional convention closed consideration of all proposed amendments amid exciting scenes.

Shortening of the ballot so as to make the governor, lieutenant-governor, attorney-general and comptroller the only elective state officers.

An executive budget system, whereby the legislature might eliminate items from the budget of the governor, but make no additions.

2.00 Votes for women. The convention merely provided that if the proposed \$1.35 suffrage amendment already passed \$302.50 by two legislatures is approved at the referendum this fall it shall become operative. \$2.20

Raising the annual salary of the governor from \$10,000 to \$20,000 a year and the salaries of legislators from \$1500 to \$2500 and railroad fare from their homes to Albany.
