BRIEF WAR NEWS

General Bernhardt, author of "Germany and the Next War," has been sent to the front on his own request.

Official announcement was made in the house of commons that the total of British war casualties up to August 21 was 381,983 officers and men killed, wounded or missing.

For the first time since the great Austro-German machine began rolling the Russians out of Galicia several months ago, Russia is now offering stubborn resistance all along the line.

It is denied in Berlin that a bill has been passed by the Reichstag increasing the age limit for army service. The bill orders reinspection of persons hitherto rejected for minor shortcomings.

The tremendous duel of big guns still marks operations along the Franco-Belgian and Italian fronts. Except for occasional attempts to rush advanced trenches, there is little infantry activity on either side.

The German submarine which sank the White Star liner Arabic has returned to its base, the commander of the vessel reporting to the German admiralty that the Arabic indicated by its tactics that she was about to attack the submarine and that he acted in self-defense.

By their latest attack in eastern Galicia, the Russians are reported to have penetrated Austro-German trenches in the face of an exceptionally heavy artillery fire. To the north, the Russians are withdrawing steadily from the dangerous Niemen salient, opposing the German advance merely by stubborn rear guard actions.
