General Bernbardi, author of "Germany and the Next War." has been sent to the front on his own request.

Official announcement was made in the house of commons that the total of British war casualties up to August 21 was 381,983 officers and men killed, wounded or missing.

For the first time since the great Austro-German machine began rolling the Russians out of Galicia several months ago, Russia is new offering stubborn resistance all along the line. It is denied in Berlin that a bill has been passed by the Reichstag increasing the age limit for army service. The
