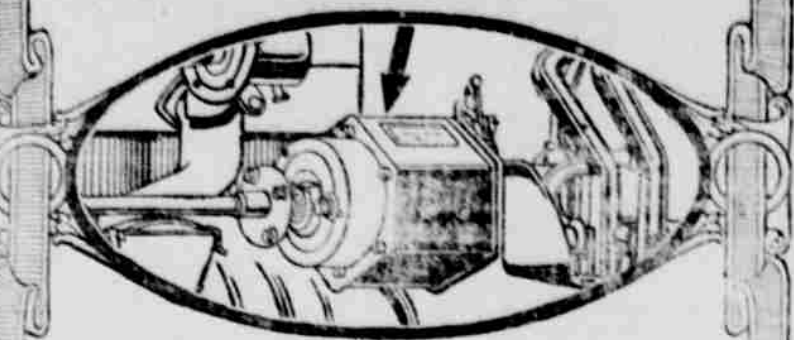

JOBS GO BEGGING IN CHICAGO.
Chicago, Oct. 2.—Howard D. Ebey, assistant chief of the local federal employment bureau, announces that the bureau has at its disposal more jobs than it is able to find men for.
Most of the jobs are for farm hands although there are many for other classes of labor. The bureau has supplied several hundred jobs of this kind within the last two months.
"We have been doing so much business that we have had to move to larger quarters," said Mr. Ebey. "We have more than enough jobs for the men we can find to fill them. If there are men in Chicago who want work there is no need for their remaining idle. All they have to do is apply to this bureau."

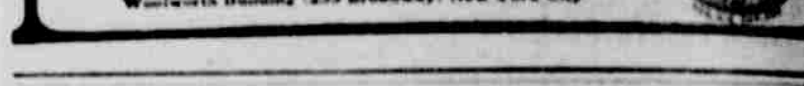
DAIRY FEEDING
"The heavy producing cow, even on good pasture, should receive some grain, since it is impossible for her to secure sufficient nutrients on grass alone," says Professor R. R. Graves, of the O. A. C. Dairy department. "A Jersey or Guernsey cow producing more than 20 pounds of milk a day, or a Holstein or Ayrshire producing more than 25 pounds, should receive approximately one pound of grain for each pound of milk produced by a Jersey or Guernsey, and one pound to each seven pounds produced by a Holstein or Ayrshire. In poor, the grain ration should be heavier."

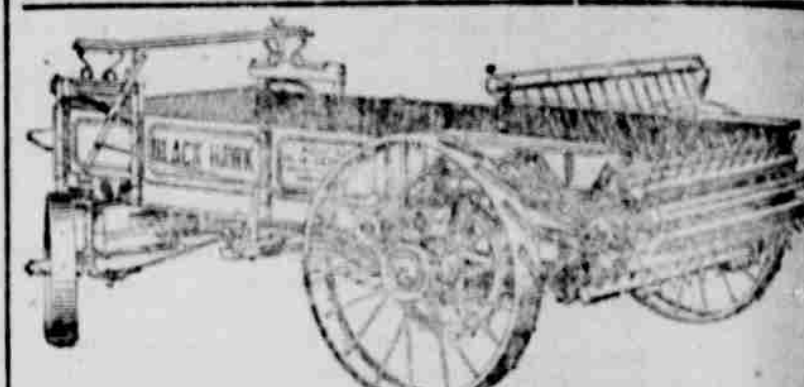
Notice of Administrator's Final Account

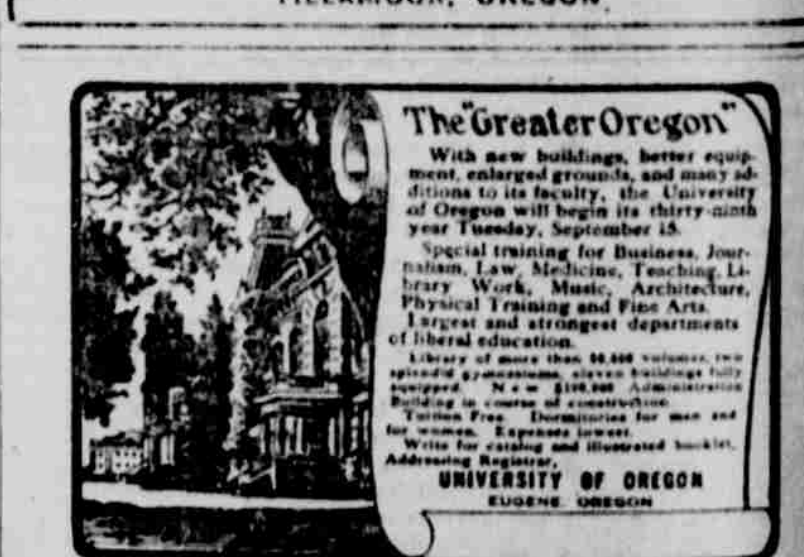
