WHEELER NOTES

Taken from Wheeler Reporter: The number of large orders that have been coming in lately have rapidly depleted the stock on hand of the **Wheeler Mill**, of this city, which mill has been idle over a year. Should orders continue for another month as they have in the past few months, there will not be a stick of merchantable timber left in the yards of this company.

After having been idle for a couple of months, the lumber mill at Brighton owned by the **Brighton Mills Co.**, has again resumed operations, work having started last Monday. A full crew of men is employed and the owners expect to operate the mill until at least the first of the year and probably until much later, depending on the market, which is now stronger than during the past year.

Although the lumber will have to be shipped by rail, the company expects sufficient water facilities by Spring to enable boats to handle their product.

W. S. York and **G. L. Archibald** of Wheeler were arrested last Friday on complaint of **H. Tubbesing** and **Oscar Bergman** of Nehalem, such complaint stating that Messrs. **York** and **Archibald** lifted set-net anchors of the latter parties while engaged in fishing for salmon, thus allowing the nets of the complaining parties to drift inshore. The nets were set at **Dean's** drift and while "taking" that drift the nets of **York** and **Archibald** became entangled in the nets of **Tubbesing** and **Bergman**, necessitating the former to lift the anchors of the latter to disentangle the nets.

The warrant was served by Constable **Flemboy** and the case was tried before Judge **Thompson** of the Justice Court at Nehalem, Saturday. **Archibald** and **York** waived examination to the Circuit Court and were released after each one of them had deposited a \$200 bond.
