The Dredge Oregon Now at Work

Tillamook Bay Channel Being Dredged to a Depth of 22 Feet. Work Progressing Nicely

On Thursday the editor of the Herald, accompanied by A. A. Pennington, visited the dredge Oregon which is at work on the Tillamook Bay channel. During the absence of Captain Shook who has command of the dredge, we were very courteously shown about the big dredge by Chief Engineer Bridges.

The engines which operate the dredge have from 600 to 700 horse power, and a machine shop, lighting plant and blacksmithing plant are operated in conjunction with the dredge proper in carrying on the work. About 21 men are now employed on the dredge, although the dredge has accommodations and generally work for 24 men. All of the single men live on the dredge, there being fine accommodations for eating for the men.

The dredge at present works eight hours a day. It is thought that later on a double shift will be worked. About 250 feet of pipe is now used to carry off the dredgings which are composed of gravel and rocks. The engineers figure that it is not necessary to pump the dredgings further than 350 feet away because of the fact that they are composed of 60 per cent heavy solid matter. A cut 210 feet wide and nine feet deep is being made. The channel will be about 2 1/2 miles long.

During the past summer the channel over the bar was from 20 to 22 feet deep at low water and it is anticipated that with the completion of the channel which will give the water more force in running out of the bay and the completion of the jetty which is now two-thirds completed, the channel over the bar will measure about 25 or 27 feet at low water. This depth of water will let a good sized vessel into the bay at any time.

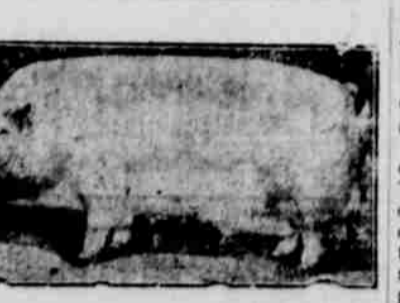
MRS. M. J. CONE DEAD

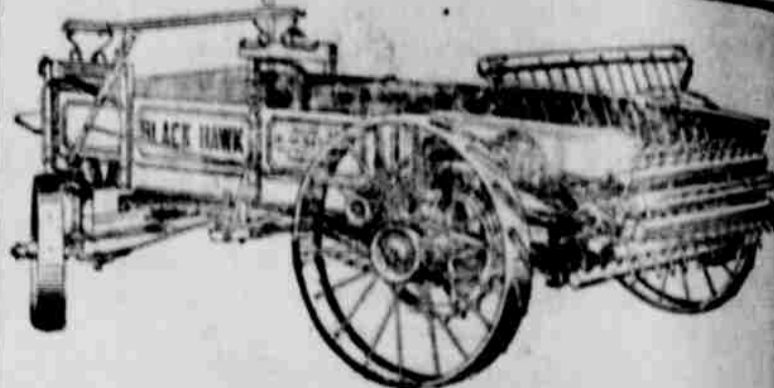
