TILLAMOOK COW TESTING ASSOCIATION.

Honor use of all cows producing over 20 pounds of milk in six months during September, 1915.

There are many cows besides the above list that come very close to the 20 lb. mark but a cow had to be milked continuously for six weeks as the standard. The advantages to be gained by following up the testing of your herd year after year are many. The farmer should keep books on every item of his business and the milk items on the dairy farm are the

most important. The testing of cows has shown conclusively that the success in dairy farming hinges more than any thing else, on the quality of the cows kept.

The Testing Association is the cheapest way of keeping records of the individual cows and it is hoped that next year many more will avail themselves of this means of keeping track of their business. Every dairy man in Tillamook should belong to the Testing Association and apply the knowledge that he gains through it.
