ALL NEED MORE EXERCISE
British Surgeon Advises Americans to
Devote at Least One Day a
Week to It.

"Almost any day of the week in
England and one day in America
is devoted to the 'fad' of
exercise," says a British surgeon,
Dr. Harold G. B. Smith, who is
professor of physical education at
the University of Edinburgh.
He says that the American
people are in a state of physical
depression, and that the only
way to overcome this is by
devoting at least one day a week
to some form of exercise.

Education in Hawaii
It is the opinion of Vaughan Mac-

TELLS ALL ABOUT AIRPLANE
Explanation of the Mystery of Fly-
ing, Made for the Benefit of
the Uninitiated.

The airplane is being used more and
more today for travel, and if you want
to know about the latest method of
transportation, you want to know
something about the airplane and its
operation. A writer in the Christian
Science Monitor explains the mystery
of flying in a simple and interesting
manner. He says that the airplane
is a machine that is able to fly
because of the way it is built. The
wings are curved on the upper surface
and flat on the lower surface. This
curvature causes the air to flow
faster over the top of the wing than
underneath. This creates a difference
in pressure, which causes the wing
to rise. The airplane is also able to
fly because of the way it is controlled.
The pilot can move the wings up and
down, and he can move the tail
section forward and backward. This
allows him to control the airplane's
altitude and direction.

Gems to be seen in sky
Many Really Beautiful Things May Be
Observed With the Aid of an
Opera Glass.
If you see an opera glass in dark
places you may see the stars and
planets in the sky, says Leland
Hillstrom.
All that need be done is to make the
glass work in light, either sideways
or up and down.
You will then find the line of sight
marked by the stars and planets will
be a fine representation of the
universe and will show the stars
and planets in their true colors.
The opera glass should be held in
the right hand and the left hand
should be used to steady it. The best
time to use the opera glass is in the
evening, after the sun has set in the
northwest sky.
Another excellent subject for celestial
viewing is the well-known Dog
star, the brightest of all the stars
of heaven.
It makes its appearance in early win-
ter, in the southeast.
