FARM POINTERS

(By O. A. C. Experimental Station)

The kind of chicks hatched this spring will depend partly on the kind of eggs set. Grading the proper percentage, a two ounce egg of normal shape and color for the breed should produce the desired kind of chicks.

Hubam clover is a very much over advertised sort. Reports from other states confirm what has been found out at this station, that is, that both the white and yellow biennial sweet clover appear to have many advantages over the Hubam clover from the more reasonably priced seed.

If nitrate of soda or sulfate of ammonia are applied to the orchard cover crop at the rate of 100 pounds to the acre within the next 10 days it will probably more than pay for itself in increased growth of the crop. The nitrogen applied in February will bring on a heavy succulent growth which decays rapidly and gives large quantities of humus. That humus will be an important factor in retaining moisture in the growing season. The cover crop must be plowed under before it saps the moisture and before the plants become woody.

More and more farmers are coming to learn of planting seed tested for purity. As a result government analysts are needed and there is a demand for commercial testers. The largest seed testing class in the history of the Oregon Agricultural college is now studying that subject. Any seed sent to the station will be tested promptly.
