FIRE CHIEFS THANK HELLO GIRLS FOR AID

"Miss Gladys I. McDonald, Chief Operator Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company, Tillamook, Ore.: I personally and on behalf of the Tillamook Fire Department, I wish to thank you and every one connected with The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company for your hearty cooperation during the past in our efforts to keep down the fire losses in this city. Depending as we do upon the telephone for our fire alarms, we feel that you are in a measure a part of the fire department, the efficiency of which is largely based on the promptness with which an alarm is transmitted and answered, or rather responded to. So prompt and efficient is your service been during 1921 that out of twelve fire alarms we were able to respond so quickly that ten of them resulted in losses of not to exceed \$750, or about \$35 each, and in no instance was any loss occasioned by delay in the telephone service. As a fireman, I realize the short length of time which it takes to change an inefficient fire with a loss of from \$25 to

\$100 to a fire beyond control, and only by the most prompt and efficient telephone service could the fire department have accomplished what it did. In passing, I may say that you are equally entitled to a good part of the credit of winning for Tillamook 'Honorable Mention' in the 1920-1921 contest for the Thomas H. Ince Cup, wherein Tillamook won second place among the Oregon contestants.—Thos. Coates, Chief Tillamook Fire Department.
