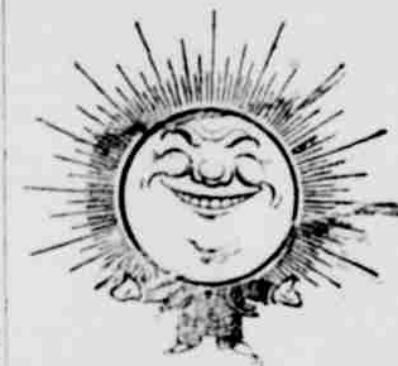

b-u-n-k

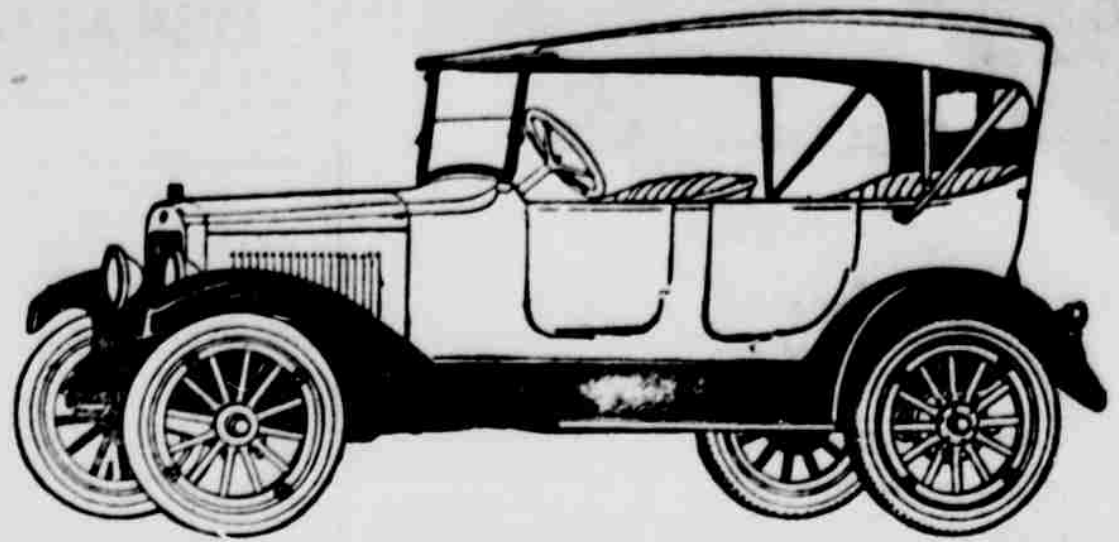
