MEYERS MATCHED TO FIGHT HALLOWELL

Myers' fight fans are going to see a real battle here on Saturday night, May 20, when the Tillamook Boxing Commission stages their second card of the benefit of the American Legion.

The main event will be a ten-round one between Ed Hallowell, of Brighton Camp Four and Bobby Myers of Tillamook. Myers will be no set-up for the Brighton leather pusher. On the contrary Hallowell is going to be in for a real tough time of it, if the whippersnaps that are coming out of the Myers training camp are taken for anything.

Myers, as far as the fans go, has his reputation to make as a fighter just as had Hallowell on his previous and final appearance here last month. As a wrestler Myers is very favorably known here, having yet to be thrown by a man in his class. His trainers claim that as a boxer he is the find of the season; and that he carries a terrific wallop in either hand.

One day this week in workouts he is reported to have sent three spare no partners to the cleaners.

Hallowell, too, is working out daily, and while the lads from up Camp Four way are not boasting any, yet have it known that the Hallowell that fought Everest here last month and the Hallowell that goes on with Myers are two different persons so far as boxing and mixing it are concerned for he has developed wonderfully under the tutorage of an old-time pug.

Myers will weigh in at 150, Hallowell will perhaps go on at 155.

The semi-main event looks promising. In this six-round go the fans will be introduced to Auler of the Whitney Company mill at Garibaldi. He will exchange wallops with "Kangaroo" Jimmy Anderson, the lad that fought Funk here last smoker. In tangling with Jimmy the Whitney mill favorite will have to step lively for Jimmy carries the fight to his opponent at every stage and sets an awful pace. This ought to be some scrap.

Stark and G. Anderson are scheduled to appear again in a four-round mill and Gooch and Bennett, two 160-pounders have been signed for the other preliminary.

Every man that steps into the ring will be in good physical condition this time, and barring K. O.'s or the like the bouts should go the limit. Matchmaker Mann and the Boxing Commission have required that every man going on appear before them first for try-outs.

Several aspirants were limited via this route, so it would seem that only top-notch local lads are being signed for this event.

HOFF'S RECORD

The candidates election pamphlet contains the following statement in behalf of state treasurer O. P. Hoff, who is a candidate for re-election as to why he should be nominated and re-elected: "His oath of office is his only pledge. His record is your guarantee. His experience is your protection." It is therefore incumbent upon the voter to scan the record that is your guarantee, and the experience that is your protection.

The last report of the Industrial Accident Commission shows that \$100,000 has been marked off from the value of securities in the Industrial Accident fund for depreciation—as a result of investments made with the funds by State Treasurer Hoff.

The grand jury, of which Gideon Stolz, of Salem was foreman found that the state treasurer often paid for bonds long before their issuance or delivery, and that the bond brokers were permitted to make extortionate profits at the expense of the state. The jury reported:

"State Treasurer Hoff purchased from Mr. Etheridge of Morris Bros. Inc. from January 6, 1919, to March 15, 1920, Bonds of the par value of \$1,106,629.09 at a cost to the State of Oregon of \$1,172,223.12, which Bonds cost Morris Bros. \$1,088,147.03, giving the enormous profit to Morris Bros. Inc. of \$84,076.09. The records further reveal that bonds which were not in existence had been sold by Mr. Etheridge to State Treasurer Hoff at an exorbitant profit, and payments in full made thereon by the State Treasurer.

Instead of purchasing bonds on the open market or buying directly from municipalities and saving the state excessive commissions Treasurer Hoff had practically all of his purchases through the one bond house, permitting them to make excessive profits.

The grand jury severely criticised the "right apparently given by state treasurer Hoff whereby Morris Bros. Inc. were authorized to withdraw securities sold to the state some of which were offered for sale by Morris Bros., while they were yet held by the state treasurer." The bond house has authority to sell any first class security held by the state and substitute other security for it, leading the grand jury to remark "there should be no strings upon any of the bonds purchased by the state of Oregon." Further, the grand jury reported:

"We condemn the policy of state treasurer Hoff in investment of such large sums in one investment; also condemn his practice of buying bonds that pay a high rate of interest regardless of the property that must receive the principal. Such a fund should apply to investment of public funds. Why should not the state of Oregon use as much intelligence in the investment of its funds as it does in buying supplies."

After the adjournment of the legislature, representative J. G. Kearnardon succeeded in securing as deputy treasurer and practically all of the state treasurer's bond business was carried over to John L. Etheridge of Morris Bros. Inc. who invested the state funds in whatever security at whatever price he desired and reaped a fabulous profit, the state treasurer apparently not caring about the security as long as the interest was at a high rate.

As a result of the expose, the grand jury recommended the taking away from the state treasurer the right of investing state moneys and the placing of it with the state board of control—a recommendation enacted into law at the next session of the legislature. Mr. Hoff was not and is not accused of dishonesty but his competency was challenged. The conduct of his office has demonstrated his lack of business acumen.

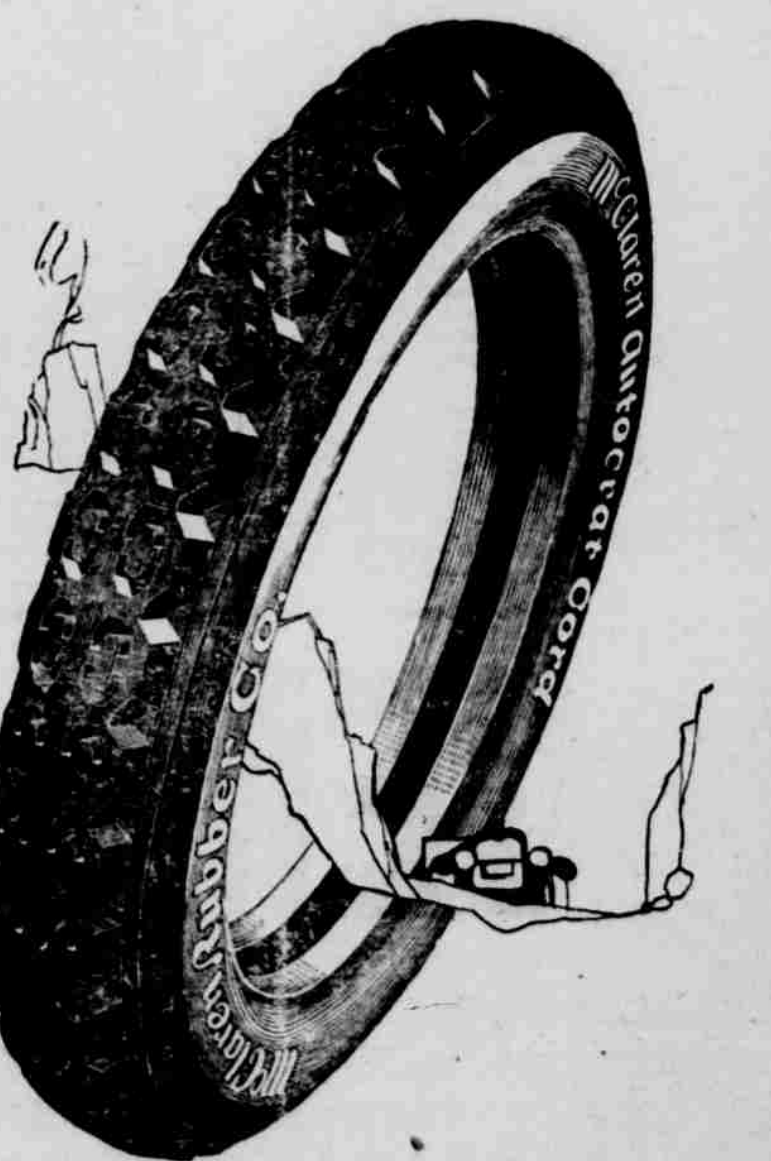
