BAKER DECRIES BOND INCREASES

To the Editor of the Tillamook Herald: There is no disguising the fact that there is more or less just complaint about high taxation in Tillamook.

For a number of years the people of this city have been wanting that and the other thing, and, unfortunately have paid little attention to the real need of the city, the thing that will put new life and activity into it, and bring new industries and people into our midst to help pay the taxes.

That one thing is water transportation. Far more important than any matter of importance taken hold of by the city council or the school board in the past history of the city.

But what have the city been doing? Simply this: Piling up bonded indebtedness year after year and so on.

At it is necessary to look at the street of Tillamook and bonded indebtedness, it is perfectly proper to consider the predicament Tillamook city is in without water transportation.

The matter of dredging a channel from Tillamook Bay to Tillamook future development of this part of the River is absolutely necessary to the county, and the great benefits to be derived therefrom call for this work to be done as soon as possible.

Here is the stumbling block. With the present high rate of taxation in our city, it would be exceedingly unwise to make taxation higher and more burdensome, in fact, they should be reduced, so as to provide money for the dredging of a channel to Tillamook river.

It requires no argument to show the needs and necessities, and the great benefits the people, including the dairymen, will derive from water transportation. The large amount of money paid out this spring for transportation here should set everyone to thinking, especially the dairymen.

In 1921 and 1922, the hay shipped into the county was 342 cars annually. This year it will be 400 cars, at an average of \$500.00 per car, total expenditure of \$200,000.00 for hay, not taking into consideration expenditure for other feed stuffs.

As long however, as the city continues to increase its bonded indebtedness at frequent periods, it is making it that much harder for the city and vicinity to procure water transportation.

It is a whole lot of people continue to want this, that and the other thing, which property owners have to pay for in hard earned cash or lose their property, I am sorry to say.

It is up to the people of this city and vicinity to decide this most important matter, after giving it thoughtful consideration. That decision will decide whether this part of the county will drift backward while other parts of the county make rapid growth and development.
