POPULISTS IN COUNCIL.

The Populist county convention was held at Medford last Saturday. Grant Rawlins, chairman of the county central committee, called the meeting to order and on motion proceeded to appoint committee on credentials, resolutions and order of business. After the report of the committees on credentials a motion was made to proceed at once to effect a permanent organization. Chairman Rawlins ruled the motion out of order on the ground that he, as chairman of the county central committee was entitled to preside over the convention; therefore he proposed to hold the fort. But he didn't hold it.

The convention recognized neither his right nor his ability to preside over the meeting. On appeal to the house he was promptly turned down and J. W. Marksbury elected to the chair. Mr. Rawlins, though an energetic political worker, has yet to learn that presiding over a deliberative body is not one of his accomplishments. J. Jeffrey was elected as permanent secretary. The committee on Order of Business then reported, after which the convention adjourned for dinner. On convening, the committee on Resolutions reported several resolutions, all of which were adopted, the most prominent being one condemnatory of the Jacksonville ring, which was received with a storm of applause. At this point a telegram from Jacksonville was handed to the chairman as follows:

To the Mayor of Medford: Have special police ready to watch courthouse ring this afternoon. MANY CITIZENS.

This of course brought out prolonged cheering. The convention then proceeded to elect 8 delegates to state convention, with following result:

J. W. Marksbury, S. H. Holt, S. Danielson, W. H. Breese, J. Jeffrey and L. J. Mark.

Nomination of candidates was next in order resulting in following ticket:

State Senator, S. H. Holt, Medford; Representatives, S. M. Nealon, Table Rock; J. W. Marksbury, Gold Hill; J. Jeffrey, Applegate.

County Commissioner, W. H. Bradshaw, Brownsboro; County clerk, N. A. Jacobs, Medford; Sheriff, S. Patterson, Ashland; Recorder, Grant Rawlins, Central Point; Treasurer, J. B. Welch, Central Point; Assessor, Geo. Jackson, Table Rock; County school Sup't, E. E. Smith; Surveyor, R. Kennedy, Applegate; Coroner, Dr. Brower, Ashland.
