Rotate Land For Strawberries

Serious strawberry root infesting insects make it inadvisable to grow strawberries more than two full crop years on the same land. Plow the field in the fall subsequent to harvesting the second crop of strawberries and use the land in a rotation for crops other than strawberries for at least a three year period.—O.O.C. Exp. Station.

Clean Up Orchard in The Fall

In Orchards where brown rot has been prevalent it much benefit may be derived by removing the rotted fruit from the ground as well as from the trees. Some growers turn hogs in to clean up the old prunes, while others think it pays to rake up the rotted prunes and destroy them. If allowed to remain on the ground they eventually produce spores that perpetuate the disease.—O.A.C. Exp. Station.

Remove Garden Refuse

At the end of growing season all plant remains should be carefully removed from the gardens, since many plant diseases and insect pests may be perpetuated through the winter in old refuse and attack new plants in the spring.—O.A.C. Exp. Station.
