

NOTICE OF SCHOOL MEETING

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN to the legal voters of Union High School District No. 1, of Columbia County, State of Oregon, that a SCHOOL MEETING of said district will be held at High School on the 25th day of November, 1922, at 2 o'clock in the afternoon for the purpose of discussing the budget hereinafter set out with the levying board, and to vote on the proposition of levying a special district tax.
