**ISRAEL P SPENCER
PIONEER, PASSES ON**

After an illness of several months duration, Israel P. Spencer, pioneer and respected citizen of the Nehalem county, answered the final call Thursday morning of last week, and passed on to join the thousands of comrades gone on before. Deceased was one of the best known residents of Columbia county. He settled in the Nehalem in the early 70's and until his death resided there continually. He was a G. A. R. veteran and a member of John Bucher Post, G. A. R. of Vernonia. According to Judge Martin White, Mr. Spencer was one of the first county commissioners of Columbia county, having been elected to that office after the legislature in 1887 passed a bill that in addition to the county judge, the affairs of the county should be handled by two commissioners. Mr. Spencer served the county for a number of years in this capacity. In respect to his memory the flag on the court house was at half-mast Thursday. Funeral services were conducted at Vernonia Nov. 11 and the interment in Vernonia cemetery. Judge White and Commissioners Fullerton and Weed were present to pay their last respects to deceased. Mr. Spencer is survived by his widow, two sons and three daughters, all of whom reside in Oregon. He is well known among the "old timers" in St. Helens who sorrow that their old friend has passed on—St. Helens Mist.

Miller Commissioner

The race for commissioner between J. N. Miller and William Pringle was a close contest. Clatskanie gave Miller almost an unanimous vote while the Nehalem valley went strong for Pringle. Rainier also gave Mr. Pringle a good majority but this was offset by the heavy vote Miller polled in St. Helens, Warren and Scappoose. Miller carried the county by 149 votes.

**PASSING OF CIVIL
WAR VETERAN**

Israel Putman Spencer, pioneer of 1876 died at his home, Wednesday evening, Nov. 8, 1922, after several months of invalidism. He was a member of John Bucher Post, No. 70, G. A. R. and took an active interest in all pertaining to that order. Deceased was born June 3, 1844 at Deruyter, Madison Co. New York, the son of Job and Wealth the Spencer. At the age of twenty two years he enlisted in Co. A., 136 Regiment, New York Volunteers. He was mustered in at the Camp of bustruction at Portage, New York Sept, 26 1862 and arrived at Washington D. C. Oct. 6, 1862. He was in seventeen battles ranging through six states, besides the battles of Chancellorsville, Lookout Mt. Gettysburg and Bentonville, being wounded at the two latter places. He was with Sherman's army on it's famous march to the sea. Afterwards they marched to Richmond, Va. and from there to Washington, D. C. and were mustered out; Mr. Spencer receiving his discharge June 13, 1865. He then went to Michigan and on Oct. 3, 1872 he was united in marriage to Elvira B Skidmore at Rose Mich. One child Emily C. was born to this union, the mother passing away Nov. 15, 1873. Later Mr. Spencer came to Oregon and in 1876 he came to the Nehalem Valley where he made his home until death. On June 8, 1880 he was united in marriage to Sarah A Gillihan and to this union four children were born. In 1887 he was elected a commissioner for Columbia Co., and served in that capacity for several years. On 1913 Mr. Spencer visited the East and attended the Grand Army reunion at Gettysburg. The wife and following children mourn his loss, Emily E. wife of Gus Richards, Chicago; Omar C. Spencer and Mrs. Orri G Faulkner of Portland; Margaret E. wife of T. R. Throop and Robert L Spencer of Vernonia; and one step daughter, Bertha C. wife of Otto Malmsten of Seaside Oregon, and eleven grandchildren. He was a loving husband and father and a friend one could well be proud to have. The funeral was held Friday and was attended by a large concourse of friends. Omar C. Spencer, Robert L Spencer, T. R. Throop, Otto Malmsten, Albert Parker and O. G. Weed Judson Weed Commander of the Post gave a review of his acquaintance with Mr. Spencer. Rev. Haverling conducted the service at the Evangelical Church and the body was laid to rest in the local cemetery, H. W. Prickett, directing.

Armistice Day, Saturday, was observed by several Vernonians in various cities—mostly going to Portland. In addition to the celebration and program with magnificent parades, the main attraction was the unveiling of the Roosevelt Statue, witnessed by 40,000 people, Saturday night the city streets were swarmed and the noise of the carnival was as loud as that of the first Armistice Day, four years ago.

Mayor White was in Forest Grove Monday taking in a road meeting the Grove Boosters put on. Timber and Forest Grove are working for the Inland Loop Highway, as well as other towns in route. Mr. White is working for the Highway from Portland to the Sea by the way of the Nehalem Valley. Says he don't care much how it goes so it goes through Vernonia.
