

A Bill: For an act xtending the route of the 'Roosevelt Coast Military Highway' along the route of the highway now known and disig, nated as the Inland High-

Be it enacted by the people of the state of Oregon:

Section 1. That the route of the Roosevelt Coast Military Highway as now disignated by law under the provisions of Sections 4527 to La s, and amendatory acts thereto, be and the same is hereby extended so as to in clune the route of what is now designated as the Inland Highway, running from Astoria through Olney and the Nehalem Valley in Clatsop uing on to the city of Portland along said route of the Inland Highway.

Sec. 2. That all of said portion of aaid highway, as described in said Section 1, and heretofore known as the Inland Highway, shall herein after be known and designated as the 'Roosevelt Coast Military Highway."


