California and Oregon Rotary club members plan to hold an interstate meeting at Crater lake July 27, to which a caravan of automobiles from Portland and Willamette valley towns will go from Portland the morning of July 25.

One million dollars' worth of state highway bonds will be offered for sale immediately by the state board of control. This issue will match the federal amount to be applied on the construction of post and forest roads in the state.

An association of men's classes of the churches and Sunday schools of Salem to establish a civic unit that shall have a competent voice in discussing public affairs, will be worked out during the summer with Ronald Glover as chairman.

Rev. E. E. Gilbert, district superintendent of the Salem district of the Methodist Episcopal church, and Mrs. Emma B. Morgan, also of Salem, were married in Portland at the home of Bishop William O. Shepard, of the Methodist Episcopal church.

Residents of LaPine are making preparation to put important data into the hands of state officials and others who are to tour central Oregon preparatory to the interstate commerce commission hearing in Portland relative to railroad development in that part of the state.

Representatives of the Oregon public service commission, Professor Peter Crockett, economist of the University of Oregon, and others started Monday on an automobile tour throughout central Oregon in the interest of the visualized railroad development in that part of the state.

Rural credit unions in the state are subject to the double liability imposed by the state in case of insolvency, Attorney-General Van Winkle notified Superintendent of Banks Bramwell. Such unions are doing a banking business and are subject to the same laws as banking houses, is the attorney-general's opinion.

Appointment of members of the state livestock board made by Governor Pierce put M. R. Biggs of Prineville in the place of K. G. Warner of Pendleton, resigned. Harry West of Seapooze, J. H. Dobbin of Enterprise and Walter K. Taylor of Corvallis are reappointed and J. R. Cole of Molalla and B. T. Sims of Oregon Agricultural college are held over.

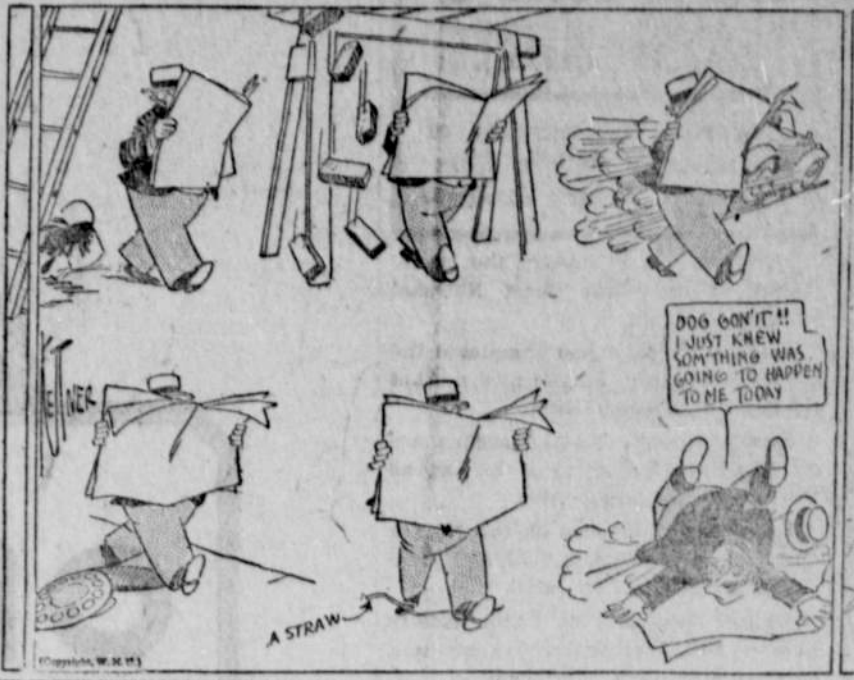
The President Harding flag for an increase of not less than 25 per cent in membership of troops has been won by the Corvallis Boy Scout council, reports H. A. Scullen, scout commissioner. Although only a second-class district now, plans are under way to consolidate Benton county with nearby counties and form a first-class district, with a full-time paid executive.
