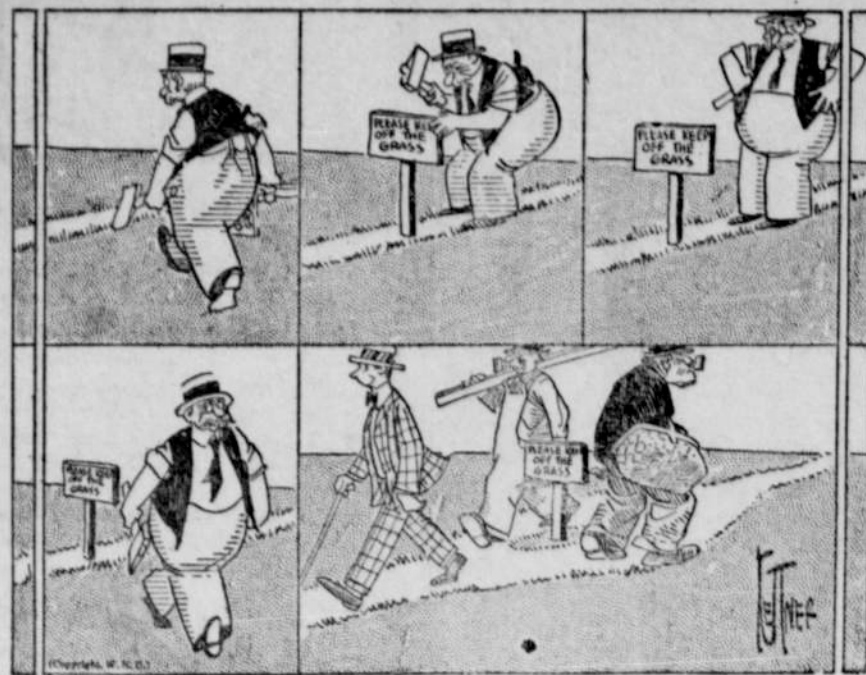


Our Pet Peeve

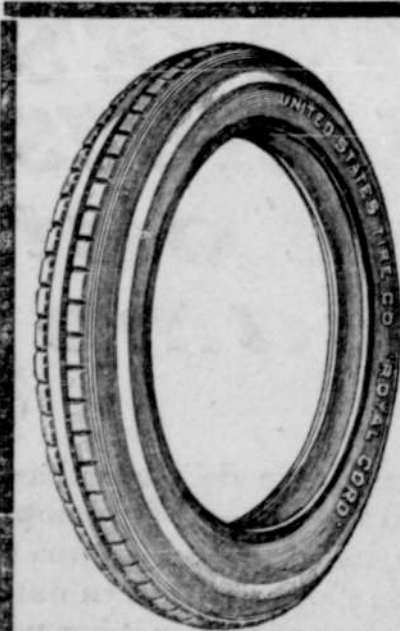
