A number of farmers in Columbia County are plugging on trying the Hungarian vetch this year. Hungarian vetch has been grown for a number of years at the Oregon Agricultural College and has proven to be quite valuable in the station tests and on the farms where it has been grown. It produces a good hay or silage crop, and about 25 per cent more feed than other varieties. Will stand more severe winter conditions. On wet or poorly drained soils it has proven superior to any other variety. It has stood the attacks of aphids when other crops were badly injured. Hungarian vetch is sown at the rate of 80 lbs per acre when sown alone, and 60 lbs with 40 lbs. of winter oats.
