OREGON NEWS ITEMS OF SPECIAL INTEREST

Brief Resume of Happenings of the Week Collected for Our Readers.

Hotel men from all sections of the state will hold a convention in Salem Saturday, February 16.

The Pendleton branch of the Oregon export commission league has obtained 947 paid members, according to report.

The city of Roseburg has abandoned the project for a bridge across the South Umpqua river to Umpqua Park addition.

Mrs. Joseph W. Lytle, mother of Dr. W. H. Lytle, state veterinarian, died in Salem of apoplexy. She was 74 years of age.

Oregon has 50,000 deer in her national forests, according to game census figures completed by officials of the forest service.

G. H. Warmington, a farmer living near Yamhill, was killed by a south-bound electric train as it approached the station of Krono.

Bonds in the sum of \$15,000 will be issued by the city of Roseburg June 2 to provide money for the purchase of a fire truck and adequate apparatus for the fire department.

The exchequer of Columbia county has been enriched to the extent of \$21,384, which represents fines collected by the justices of the peace in the county during 1923.

Returns from practically every important community in Columbia county show a total of \$1628 collected for the Red Cross during the recent annual membership campaign.

The site for the proposed bridge over the Willamette river at Albany as selected by the state highway engineers has received the approval of United States army engineers.

Edgar B. Watters, postmaster at Stayton was arrested by a deputy United States marshal, on a secret indictment charging misappropriation of the funds of the postoffice.

Miss Nora Ellis, found not guilty at Pendleton of a charge of murder in the first degree by reason of insanity, was committed to the eastern Oregon hospital for the insane by Judge Phelps.

Lyman L. Pierce of San Francisco, a successful leader of financial campaigns, has been signed by the trustees of Albany college to handle the state campaign for \$500,000 for Albany college.

After inflicting dangerous wounds on Miss Ethel Stearns, lodging-house keeper of Klamath Falls, Al "Curley" Powers, 36, turned a revolver upon himself, ending his life with a bullet through his brain.

Subjects in which textbooks to be adopted for the six-year period starting in June, 1925, are being sent out to the state textbook commissioners by J. A. Churchill, state superintendent of schools.

The Bend Water, Light & Power company has completed its new \$70,000 filter plant. Testing will be completed this week when the plant will be put into actual use, purifying Deschutes river water for consumption.

John J. O'Brien, said by friends and relatives to have been 195 years old and for 88 years a resident of Oregon, died in his home at Cedar Mills last week. He had resided at Cedar Mills since 1865 and in Oregon since 1835.

Owing to lack of rains during the last few weeks the streams in the western part of Lane county, especially the Siuslaw river, are too low for successful logging. The deficiency in rainfall this winter is several inches.

Charles Overton, councilman from the 3d ward of Newport, was recalled in a special election by 49 votes and Captain Clarence Lockwood was elected to take his place. L. C. Smith and Henry Stocker, under recall in the 2d ward, were retained in office.

A movement to stage a recall of three of the Astoria city commissioners, which was being launched by certain members of the Central Labor council with the alleged support of the mayor, has received a rebuff from the conservative laborites which it is believed will kill the movement.

The Oregon Purebred Livestock association, in a letter received at the offices of the public service commission, allege that the freight charges on purebred livestock in this state are unreasonable, and ask that the rates be reduced to conform with those in effect in other states and in Canada.

Statistics concerning the school census of Clackamas county for October, 1923, compiled in the office of County School Superintendent Vedder, indicate that the total number of children between 4 and 20 years of age on the completed list is 13,416, this being an increase of 599 over the census of 1922.
