Seventy-nine of the 80-men required
to form a national guard company in
Astoria have signed the roll and Ad-
jutant-General White was requested
to set Saturday, June 7, as the date
for mustering in the new company.

Roseburg high school this year is
graduating the largest class in the his-
tory of the school, and one surprising
feature is that the membership of the
class consists of 11 more boys than
girls. Sixty-five will receive diplo-
mas.

A total of \$10,547.19 was spent by
and in behalf of George L. Baker of
Portland in his candidacy for the re-
publican nomination for United States
senator, according to campaign ex-
pense statements so far filed with Sec-
retary of State Koser.

A fine of \$100 and a scathing lecture
was the penalty imposed upon Beryl
Wagner, 18-year-old Washington coun-
ty girl, who pleaded guilty before Uni-
ted States District Judge Bean in Port-
land to a charge of sending a vulgar
letter through the mail.

Clara Trenholm, 17-year-old Philo-
math girl, was killed instantly and
her parents, Mr. and Mrs. D. P. Tren-
holm, and two younger sisters were
badly injured in a train-auto crash at
the Lafayette avenue crossing just out-
side the McMinnville city limits.

Frank R. Gouldstone and C. G.
Ferry, Portland motorcycle officers,
were suspended upon order of Com-
missioner Stanhope S. Pier, in charge
of the police bureau, for a period of
30 days while charges that they have
engaged in the practice of "highjack-
ing" bootleggers is further investigat-
ed.

In event Salem canneries refuse to
pay more than 4 cents a pound for
cherries produced this year, it is like-
ly that the growers will ship their
fresh fruit to California for disposi-
tion. This was indicated following an
announcement that several of the can-
neries had quoted the opening price
for cherries at 4 cents.

Four hundred old men and women
of the Multnomah county poor farm
last week sought new hope to escape
their lot of poverty in a frenzied hunt
for buried gold—told by spirits
through an aged seer and medium.
With sticks, shovels and hoes, they
scratched every foot of land, dislodged
rocks and dug deep for the treasure.

Oregon ranks sixth among the vari-
ous states of the union, according
to its citizens' reading and interest in
13 of the so-called higher type mag-
azines published in the United States.
This information was contained in a
report prepared by J. A. Churchill,
state superintendent of schools, based
on statistics furnished by Ward G.
Reeder of the Ohio State university.

Mrs. Lucile Smith McArthur, widow
of C. N. McArthur, who represented
the third Oregon district in congress
from 1919 to 1923, has been appoint-
ed executive clerk to the majority
leader of the national house of rep-
resentatives. The position is one of the
best in the gift of the house, as it will
pay an annual salary of \$3600 a year
under legislation now about to be an-
acted.

A few hours before James Briere,
state prisoner injured in the Kelly
Butte premature dynamite explosion
last week died in Portland, a letter
was received by the sheriff's office,
addressed to Briere, containing an ap-
peal from his sister, Mrs. Anne Arch-
amault of Montreal, Canada, for him
to come home this summer. Briere's
death brings the total to four who lost
their lives as a result of the explo-
sion.

If a majority of the legal voters of
a school district decide to discontinue
a high school, it would be unnecessary
to levy a high-school tax in the dis-
trict, and the tax included in the bud-
get may be omitted when the annual
school meeting is held next month.
This information was contained in a
legal opinion prepared by I. H. Van
Winkle, attorney-general. Robert D.
Lytle, district attorney for Malheur
county, requested the opinion.

There were two fatalities in Oregon
due to industrial accidents during the
week ending May 29, according to a
report prepared by the state industrial
accident commission. The victims
were Geentry O. Sims, Coquille, fall-
er, and Edward L. Duby, Baker, farmer.
Of the 698 accidents reported during
the week, 616 were subject to bene-
fits under the workmen's compensa-
tion act, 77 were from firms and cor-
porations that have rejected the law
and five were from public utility cor-
porations not entitled to state protec-
tion.

Postponement of the purchase of
any additional land for the boys' train-
ing school until after the next legis-
lative session was urged upon the
state board of control in resolutions
adopted by a mass meeting of Marion
county farmers in the board of control
rooms at the state house. The resolu-
tions also urged that any new build-
ing for the school at this time be con-
fined to absolute necessities. Gover-
nor Pierce, Secretary of State Koser
and State Treasurer Myers attended
the meeting, which had been arranged
to permit the voicing of protests
against the expenditure of state funds
at this time.

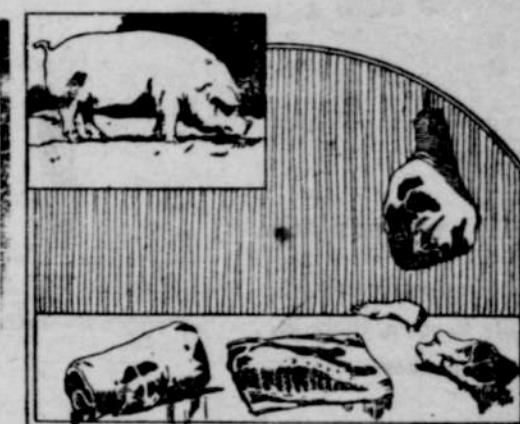
