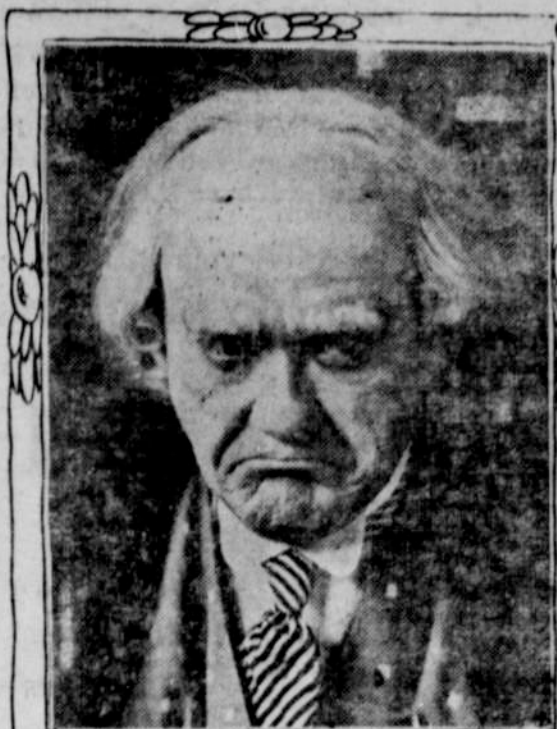

MEMORIAL DAY

The Memorial Day Program at Vernonia was good and successful from every standpoint. A parade was formed several blocks long. On Bridge street they halted in front of Mr. M. E. Carlin's place of business where the band played America and Mr. Cutter sang "Flanders Field", the bugle call and taps were blown by Mr. Skinner. From this spot the parade in command of M. E. Carlin marched to the bridge over Rock Creek where flowers were strewn on the water in honor of the dead sailors, here the services were conducted by the Ladies Relief Corps. From here the march was continued to the cemetery where graves were decorated and services held. Orders were read by Prof. John and the address of the day made by Hon. Justin Weed. Mr. Weed is one of the few G. A. R. men left in the Nehalem valley and on all occasions of this nature his talks are greatly appreciated. People in Columbia county know that a speech by Justin Weed means a big and best part of the program. The crowd in line in the parade was even larger than expected on Friday.

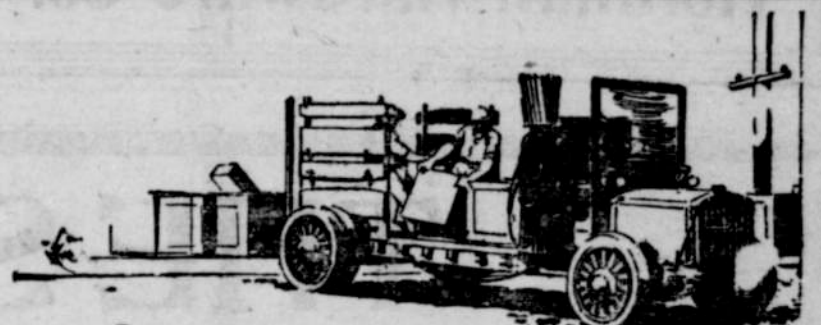
