

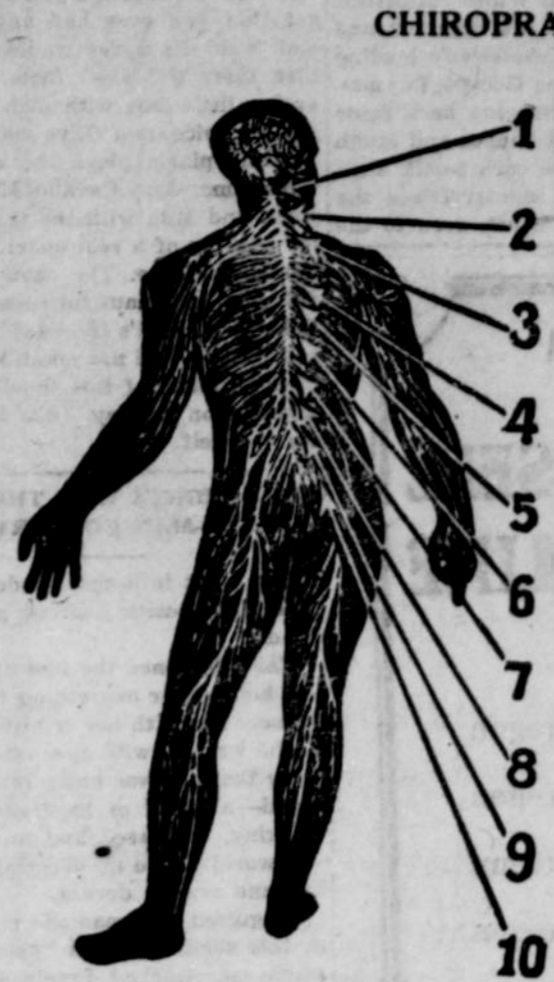
**"CAPPY RICKS" — THE PLAY FOR CHAUTAUQUA**

Great American Comedy-Drama Told in Real American Style—"Cappy" of the "Frisco Water Front" Most Delightful Character of the Modern Stage—Coming Third Night.



There is more to real humor than the things which make us laugh uproariously, as Chautauquans will realize when they see the famous comedy drama "Cappy Ricks," presented by that splendid organization, the Elias Day Players on the third night. The humor of "Cappy Ricks" is genuine because each character in it is reproduced from persons now living—most of them in San Francisco where Peter B. Kyne, author of the stories which ran in the Saturday Evening Post, studied human nature and gathered material for his successful series of character sketches. He transplanted them onto the printed page, and Edward Rose, the eminent playwright, has moved them from the story page to the center of the stage. Oliver Morosco first produced the play in New York where it had a phenomenal run of a whole year. Chicago claimed it for five consecutive months, and it has since won friends by the hundreds of thousands on the circuits of the big theaters.

Of course the irascible, blunt, "I'm always right" old sea dog "Cappy" is the central figure, and Matt Pansley, the clean-cut, courageous young mate who beat "Cappy" at his own game, is his foil. "Cappy's" pretty daughter; Skinner, the efficient office manager whom "Cappy" bulldozes; old Aunt Lucy, the only person in captivity who is not afraid of the old man; a ne'er-do-well rich man's son and the office stenographer are the characters selected from the stories by the playwright for the stage version.

**ORDINANCE NO. 75**

**AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE BURNING OF REFUSE**

The City of Vernonia does ordain as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to burn trash, lumber, leaves, straw, or any other combustible material in any street, alley or vacant lot, within the city limits, except by permit issued in writing by the chief of the fire department; such restriction, however shall apply only to an area extending one block each side of Bridge street, and extending along said Bridge street only to the extent of the fire limits.

Section 2. In burning the aforesaid material, and within the said limited district, a burner consisting of fine mesh chicken wire, with metal top, shall be used.

Section 3. Any person or persons found guilty of violation of this ordinance shall be fined not less than five (\$5.00) dollars nor more than twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars for each offense.

Section 4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the foregoing are hereby repealed.

Section 5. Whereas, it is necessary for the peace, health and safety of said City of Vernonia that this ordinance shall go into effect immediately, and an emergency is hereby declared to exist, therefore this ordinance shall take effect when adopted by unanimous vote of the members of the City Council and approved by the Mayor of said city.

pective payments for water rent.

Section 4. That said Council is hereby authorized to direct and aid the water superintendent in his securing a suitable person to receive payment for water rent, at such places or by such means as shall be designated and published; provided, that any change in such places or means shall be published at least two weeks in the local newspaper; provided further, that if payment for water usage be not made by the 10th of the month, for each month that water is used or connected up, then said water shall be shut off. A charge of \$1.00 for turning water on again.

Section 5. That each family or user of city water shall pay for the same \$2.00 per month; provided that during the dry season the charge shall be \$3.00 per lot, for sprinkling purposes for lawn or garden, by those who so use said water, and this also payable in advance, and in addition to the \$2.00 per month above stated; provided also, that application for permission for such sprinkling be first made to the City Council or water committee.

Section 6. That water meters shall be installed wherever and whenever it seems best in the judgement of the city water superintendent with the concurrence of the water committee, said meters to be charged to the city, the user of same to be charged \$2.00 flat rate for 2000 gallons.

Section 7. The water rates which shall govern in the City of Vernonia, as per meter registrations, are as follows:

Up to 2,000 gal	\$2.00
For the next 12,700 gals.	40c per 1000 gals.
For the next 130,000 gals.	30c per 1000 gals.
All over 130,000 gals. to be	20c per 1000 gals.

Section 8. Non-compliance by any person with aforesaid rates shall be deemed sufficient grounds to authorize the city water superintendent to cut off the city water supply of such person.

Section 9. All prior ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 10. Whereas, it is necessary for the peace, health and safety of said City of Vernonia that this ordinance shall go into effect immediately, and an emergency is hereby declared to exist, therefore this ordinance shall take effect when adopted by unanimous vote of the members of the City Council and approved by the Mayor of said city.

**ORDINANCE NO. 77**

An ordinance requiring owners of property within the City of Vernonia to pay for taps on water mains, connecting their respective premises therewith, and providing regulations for usage of city water and payment therefor, and declaring an emergency.

**THE CITY OF VERNONIA DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:**

Section 1. That every owner of property within the City of Vernonia, where said property or occupant thereof becomes a user of city water, shall provide for the expenses of installing a tap on the water main at the closest or most convenient point designated by the city water superintendent for such connection, the charge for said tap, for one-half (1/2) inch surface, to be \$12.50, to be paid in advance by property owner or user, as above specified; providing, that for taps above 1/2 inch surface, the additional costs to be according to installation, including material.

Section 2. That no person shall be delinquent in the requirement set forth in section one above for a longer period than 30 days after date of first publication of this ordinance.

Section 3. That the City Council shall, at such times as it may find expedient, make such reasonable provisions as it deems necessary to provide a place or places where owners of property, after becoming users of city water, or those so using under them, as provided above, in section one, shall make their re-
