PROBABLY NOT FOR THE BEST

We hear rumblings and rumors by some that an injunction would probably be made against the building of the new school house any place other than west of the R. R. with this suggestion, as it came to the Eagle ears, was the statement that the election called for the 16th should be to decide on the purchase of the Bergerson acre and the size building only, as at a recent regularly called school meeting it was decided by a 58 to 20 vote to build the new school west of the track and only one building was mentioned. We acknowledge that the call in this issue for another election is so worded that it could be termed

schrewed politics. Or some might term "a joke hidden." It compels us to vote one of two propositions: Either a 4-room house on Bergerson's acre and a 4-room house on present school yard, or to build just one 8-room house on present site. We don't go much on the injunction proposition, as it will delay the much needed room. We think it better to vote Yes on the proposition to buy the Bergerson acre and build 4-room building there and a 4-room addition to present site. Both will be found necessary and full of children, and the play grounds will not be so congested. We don't believe all our citizens fully realize how many little children live west of the railroad. Hund-

reds of them and parents dislike to send them through the busy, narrow main street of the city every day. We believe it only fair that at least one building be west of the railroad. For this reason we are inclined to believe the previous election should have stood. But now all must vote for two buildings, or they will have none west of Rock Creek.

SCAPOOSE PRODUCES LIVE ONES

J. C. Watts, of Scappoose, was in Vernonia Tuesday, and Mr. Watts is a booster of much worth. He has some 80 lots in Vernonia, splendid resident section, that he is thinking of putting on the market at a price

that one can afford to build on. The location is ideal for a preferred residential section. While visiting with Mr. Watts we naturally asked him about the Scappoose oil well. They have a real well there some 2000 feet down and the indications for oil are so good that it has reached the excitement stage. A California party is doing the pioneering in the oil fields of that part of Columbia county, and the same man is prospecting and preparing to drill near Buxton and Banks in Washington county. Mr. Watts says he believes the outward prospects for oil are better around Vernonia than any place else in the state and he advises Vernonia people to urge this California man, Mr. Miller, to secure oil leases here and try it out. There could, in our judgment, be several hundred acres secured near town and the field given a thorough try-out. When an owner leases the oil right to the party to drill on, the land owner, in case of finding oil, gets one eighth of all oil returns from that land. That is one way millionaires are made among land owners where oil is found.

NOTICE OF SCHOOL MEETING

Notice is hereby given to the legal voters of Columbia County, Oregon, School District No. 47, that a special school meeting will be held on June 16, 1924, at the hour of 2:30 o'clock p. m., at the school house in said district No. 47 for the purpose of voting upon the questions:

FIRST:

To authorize the Board of Directors of said Columbia County, School District No. 47 to purchase 1 acre from Cass Bergerson on West Bridge street for the price of \$1,300.00 and erect and equip thereon a modern four-room school building; and also to erect and equip another modern four-room school building on the present site. (Said buildings and equipment to be paid for out of the proceeds of the bond issue voted on May 27th, 1924.)

SECOND: (As an alternate proposition.)

To authorize the Board of Directors of said Columbia County School District No. 47 to erect and equip a modern eight-room school building on the present school site. (Said building and equipment to be paid for out of the proceeds of the bond issue voted on May 27th, 1924.)

By order of the Board of Directors of Columbia County Oregon, School District No. 47, made and entered at a special meeting held this 3rd day of June, 1924.
