Prominent Russian Writer-Orator Coming
 Hindus Returns From Tour of Russia Just in Time for Opening of Chautauqua Circuit.



Maurice G. Hindus, born and reared in a Russian peasant village, speaking the many peasant dialects, now an American citizen, a college graduate, Harvard man, student of economics, lecturer, author of that celebrated book, "The Russian Peasant and the Revolution," is the man best qualified to discuss this important subject—the Russia of today. He has just returned from one of several tours of investigation during which he studied conditions after six years of soviet rule. His message is "as human and dramatic as it is fresh and hopeful." He has lived with the peasants—ate with them, went to church and funerals and mass meetings with them—and being one of their native brothers, was successful in getting into their hearts and minds and souls. Furthermore, Mr. Hindus visited Germany, the Ruhr district, and narrowly escaped being shot when the president of the autonomous Republic in the Palatinate was assassinated on the 9th day of January of this year. Two lectures, "Germany and the World" and "Russia and the World" will be given in the afternoon and evening of the fourth day of Chautauqua.
